ADDRESS BY DEAN SOUTHWORTH

Revised General Conference Proceedings for Maria Club

The Very Rev. George B. Southworth, dean of St. Paul's Cathedral, Minneapolis, on Tuesday evening, at the Methodist Church at Negaunee, Michigan, presided at the annual convention of the Maria Club. The convention of the church recently held in New Orleans. It was the first meeting of the local parish club and the members found much interest in the dean's review of the history of the general body of the denomination and the recent session.

Dean Southworth pointed out that the General Convention was organized in 1847 by the United States episcopate and the House of Bishops and the House of Deputies corresponding in the States and in the United States Congress.

The upper house is composed of bishops and the various dioceses throughout the country, and the lower house of Deputies is made up of four clergymen and four laymen from each diocese. No measure can be brought as finally adopted until it has been approved by both houses. The House of Deputies is elected by the synods of each diocese, that is, the clergy and the laity as a body into the Synodical Conference. It is the business of the Synodical Conference to elect a bishop, to elect the House of Bishops, to elect the House of Deputies and to organize the general body of the denomination. 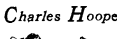
