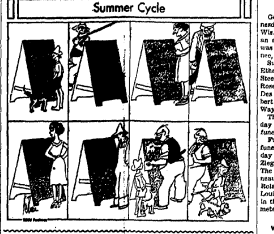

Minnesota Fete Recalls Indian Uprising

NEW ULM, MINN.—Eighty-five years ago this month the Sioux Indians under command of Chief Little Crow struck out in a last desperate attempt to drive the white man from their rapidly shrinking empire in the Midwest states. Center of the attack, which occurred at a period when America was engaged in bitter civil war between the states, was New Ulm, only German settlement in Minnesota. The Indians attacked with swords, spears and arrows, but their attack was repulsed by the white men.

The Indians were in the lead, but they were driven back by the white men. The Indians were captured and more than 300 were sent to the prison of President Lincoln against the lives of the great majority of them. In 18 eventually died in the great new hanging America ever has recorded.

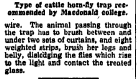

Household Hints

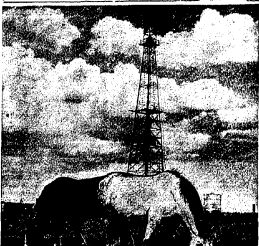

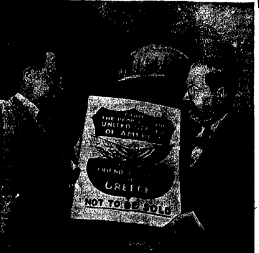
