

Work in Relocation Of US-41 Will Get Underway This Summer

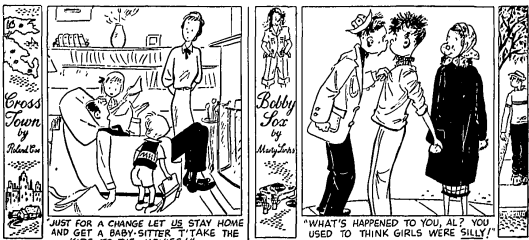

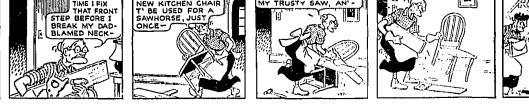

Opinions On Obtaining Road Funds Differ

Despite the many plans already laid out for the reconstruction of the Michigan State Road, there is some difference of opinion as to how to obtain the money to finance the program.

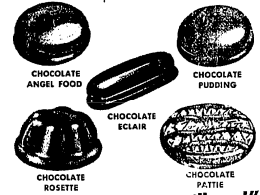

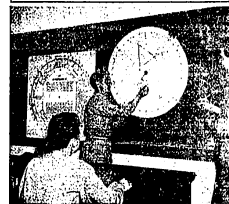
