Advise New Fly Spray For Dairy Cows

New advice on fly control came this week from officials of Michigan State College and the U. S. Department of Agriculture. They recommend that methoxy-chlor replace DDT as an insect chlor replace DDT as an insect control spray on dairy cows because of possible contamination of milk with the DDT spray ma-

No case of injury to humans is known but the fact that the presquantities in milk would be con-

trary to pure food laws makes the new recommendation necessary. Use of DDT to control flies on animals other than cows is still advised. DDT can be used to con-trol flies on beef cattle and swine if 60 days clapse between appli-cation and slaughter of the ani-

DDVP can still be used to control flies in breeding places and resting places outside dairy barns.

resting places outside dairy barns. Manure plies and moist soil that is mixed with manure are typical places where files multiply.

Ray Hutson, head of the MSC contonlogy department, Dr. Earl Wester dairy department and have been proposed to the conference of the contonlogy department hand, have conferred on federal findings and advise that methoxychior is the advise that methoxychlor is the material to use for dairy cattle fly conrol. The recommendations, being carried to farmers through MSC specialists in the Coopera-tive Extension Service, call for the use of methoxychlor inside dairy barns and directly upon the

dairy barns and directly upon the dairy cows. County agricultural agents have been notified of the new spray program and are ready to give farmers advice on using the new methoxychlor in place of DDT on dairy cattle.

Lightning Loss Can Be Reduced

Spring thunderstorms can be very helpful in making crops grow. But agricultural engineers at Michigan State College point out that lightning is the greatest cause of farm fire loss in Michi-

gan. Each year lightning destroys 20 million dolors worth of farm pro-perty in the nation and 350 thou-sand dollars worth of property in Michigan.

The MSC engineers say that a small amount, of money inves-ted in lightning protection is very small compared to the value of

the buildings protected. An ap-proved system of lightning rods, kept in good condition, is the hest defense against loss.

They urge that farmers check their lightning protection to make sure it is adequate before another thunderstorm comes


