The resolution pointed out that the structure could be constructed 50 per cent of its cost being paid by grant or the congress and the remaining 50 per cent being paid .y sale of revonce honds to private investors without obligation of any kind on the part of the state. Hotel men feel keenly that Michigan will miss a good bet if the traffic buttleneck at the Straits is not removed in the near future,

Approximately 5,000 employees of the Ford Motor Company at Denthorn will be eligible for re-tirement in April, 1950, at pen-sions of \$100 per month including Social Security benefits. The cor-pany estimates that 13,,000 er ployees are sixty years of age or over. The new pension plan will cost the company \$20,000,000 per year, Increase in the price of the Ford automobiles may be an indirect result.

With election of Wiley R. Ki-k with election of Wiley R. 81-8 of Fairgrove as chairman of the State Agricultural Commission, speculation has increased to the officer that Charles Figy, director of the State Department of Agriculture, may be replaced in the near future. Figy was reappointed by the old commission early in 1919 but the usual one-year ap-

Governor G. Mennen Williams continues to utilize the Attorney General and State Controller os agencies to put Republican state elective officials on the defensive. clective officials on the december.

The Attorney General has ruled
that purchaseshy the State Highway Department must be cleared
through the Department of Administration of which the controller is director. As republicans hold a majority on the state administrative heard, headed by the Gover-nor, the recent moves by Williams have been largely nullified.

Banks of Michigan paid a record sum of \$3,503,673 as interest carnings on Funds of the State Trensury, it was announced by State Trensurer D. Hale Brake. Brake has been mentioned as a possible Republican candidate for Commune in 1950, Accordingly in Governor in 1950. Accordingly, he has been the target of criticisms by Governor Williams, well publi cized in the press. When the Gov-ernor asked the State Treasurer to collect interest on some \$32,000,000 in state funds on deposit at banks, Brake replied with a press statement that such was not practical in view of the state need for funds and requirements of the banks for 30 to 60 or longer with-drawal notice for money on depos it drawing interest.
