## League Plans Circulation Of Petitions

Petitions for signatures of qualified electors to reconstitute a city charter in Negaunee voters will be circulated within the next few days. C. Vance Hines, chairman of the publicity committee for the League for Better Government has announced.

Organization of the league, which has as its aim to try and establish a better government organization in Negaunee was perfected at a meeting held last week.

A public meeting was originally scheduled to have been held last week but was postponed until Jan. 6th due to the holiday season and the preliminary work and the details that must be completed. Hines issued an invitation for all interested persons to attend the next session.

Committees of the league are planning policy, organization and finances and studying pool laws in addition to preparing for distribution of informational material to be distributed to all people who are interested in the movement.

"Better government is Negaunee is a matter that is of interest not to one person or a small group, but to all those who live and those who are supporting this growth and expanding their lives and energy in it are doing so because they are concerned with the general welfare of the people of this community. They desire to welcome successful and fair business local relations to give to the people."

The publicity chairman noted that the league has no funds which to conduct its movement but it is expected that material will be obtained from interested persons.

## Former Teacher Issues Reply To Board Statement

Replying to a statement issued by the Negaunee Board of Education on December 1, citing reasons for her dismissal from the local school system, Mrs. Geraldine Johnson, former girl physical education instructor, "thirring" issued the following statement:

"I, Geraldine M. Johnson, take exception to the statement prepared by the Board of Education of the City of Negaunee relative to the termination of my teaching contract because of its indefiniteness, inaccuracies in point of time, statement and interpretation, and because of its being in violation of it by the Board of Education, and to this end, I, Geraldine M. Johnson, charge that even before the meeting of the School Board on Thursday, December 1, at 7:30 p. m., the Board itself had received its proposed statement in my behalf, if not in full, at about 5 o'clock of the afternoon of that day of the meeting, which indicates that there was at no time any intention on the part of the board to authority to give me a fair and impartial hearing."

"I further charge the fact to be in an order to get the truth of the facts surrounding the entire matter, the point of time, and of statements, interpretations thereof, it will be necessary to re-engage completely the statements issued by the Board in Justice and fairness to me. All of the foregoing indicate that no proper hearing has been given me, and in this instance to have a fair educational record of my activities usually took place, which record could have been obtained had there been a proper hearing held in accordance with proper local procedure of the Board of Education of the City of Negaunee, such

## School Bond Issue Reassessment Program Highlights Of 1949

Approval of local taxpayers of a school bond issue of \$200,000 to defray expenses of constructing a school building commencing in 1949 and a modern gymnasium and completion of a new sewerage plant resulted in increasing property valuations in the town \$21,760,835 to \$137,752,215, liquidated the taxes in November during the year 1938.

The school bond issue was approved by voters at the annual election in July and resulted from the necessity of obtaining additional funds to house elementary pupils and defray the necessary educational functions of the school. Local residents did not feel the full impact of the reassessment program until the month when their statements were sent out by the assessors. The program was outlined on by representatives of the state and county officials who made a thorough survey of real estate and assessed property. In addition to an increase of approximately \$22,000,000 in value of the town's tax base, the rate was increased to thirty-one and two thirds, with this hike the town's 1949 property tax will be \$1,844 Project Approval.

Approval was finally given when a divided U. S. - 41 Highway Improvement District was formed by determining on the state highway department. It is the first time since the 1920s in Michigan and work has already been initiated by the State Construction Co. which was the successful bidder.

The year 1938 also brought a nation-wide strike of steel workers which indicated a serious iron mines on the Marquette range in the County of St. Ignace. The steel industry in Michigan for the first week in October was reported to have been down 100,000 tons.

A major improvement in the business district was completed by the city of a new building program in September. In the line of business there were only three failures, remodeling by Negaunee Lodge B. P. O. E. 1116 of its building which included installation of a new modern oval-lounge, remodeling of the quarters of the Negaunee Fire and Marine Co. which are now completed by the Negaunee Fire and Marine Co. by St. Albert of a new home for the Negaunee fire department.

Michigan friends of Mr. Sumnerfield, the Flint chairman of the Republican National Party, say they are convinced that Michigan may yet receive the national minority party from a current predicament of near total eclipse.

Since a Michigan-born man, Thomas E. Dewey, of New York, is on the losing end of the surprise election in November, 1948, the situation has more than casual interest.

It has been the belief of Mr. Sumnerfield, who is the Republican National Committeeman for Michigan, that voters are entitled to a clear-cut choice of issues in the 1949 party. Governor Dewey, the Republican national nominee in 1941 and again in 1948 offered a me-too attitude with respect to many of Roosevelt's new deal reforms.

As chairman of the national strategy committee of the Republican party, Mr. Sumnerfield has called for an end of agreement with the Democratic party in particular by saying that we can do it better.

Under the direction of Mr. Sumnerfield and the state chairman, John A. Wagner of Battle Creek, the state GOP organization fronted a vigorous campaign in 1948 being only the Governor's office in a surprise reversal caused more by antipathy of many voters to Governor Slater than any "ding" done. While Governor Dewey lost in other mid-west states, he did carry Michigan's home state, by a respectable margin.

It is the thesis of Mr. Sumnerfield that an important difference has developed between the Roosevelt and Truman administrations, "With Roosevelt we were drifting toward socialism, but with Truman there is no drift — it is a drifting toward socialism, but with Truman this, but members of congress, the governors and politicians everywhere know it if the Democrats make any sense whatsoever.
