#### ELECTRIC UTILITY ORDINANCE **City of Negaunce**

1955 NEGAUNEE CITY ORDINANCE I (14) ELECTRICITY ORDINANCE An Ordinance To Regulate the Sale and Distribution of Elec-tricity in the City of Negaunce The City of Negaunee ordains;

ARTICLE I. GENERAL

1.1 Jurisdiction - All electri-city sold and distributed by the City of Negaunee to consumer other than the City or its ager cles, shall be governed by, and be subject to, the provisions of this ordinance and to rules and 5nme gulations concerning the use electricity as may from time time be adopted and approvrept ed by the City Council.

1.2 Short Title - This ordinance shall be known as the "Electricity Ordinance of the City of Negaunee

ARTICLE II. DEFINITIONS 2.1 Definitions - As used in this ordinance, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

(a) Hook - up charge shall mean that amount of money paid by an applicant for electricity service to cover part of the expense of labor and material in installing the connection.

(b) Down deposit shall mean that amount of money paid by an applicant for electricity ser-vice to cover the estimated amount of electricity to be cop-sumed over a his-week period. Said deposit shall remain with the City Treasurer in a separate trust necessaries and the separate trust necessaries and the second of the electricity consumer until said service is disconnected, at which time a settlement of ac-counts shall be made. If any more is then due the consum-er, the City Treasurer shall re-mit to him. mount of electricity to be conmit to him.

/ (c) Rules and Regulation c) Rules and Regulations shall mean those rules and reg-ulations promulgated by the City Manager and approved by the City Council pertaining to the sale and distribution of electric 

ARTICLE III. NEW CUSTOMERS


