During his tenure on the Councit the City of Negaunee became debt free after being \$160,000 in the red at the time the councilmanager form of government went into effect. The city carried on the largest public works program in its history over the past two years, and spent well over \$50,000 in capital improvements with no additional tax levy. In addition, Negaunce ranks at the top among Peninsula cities as far as employe benefits are concerned with personnel receiving a life insurance policy paid for by the City, social security, hospitalization, pay increases and other fringe bene-

DO YOUR DUTY MONDAY

This is an opportunity that qualified electors cannot afford t pass up. If there is one thing that will assure continuance and effectiveness of the Council-Manager form of government in Negaunce, it is the constant effort by the citizenry to elect the best possible representation on the governing body.

If there is one thing that is disconcerting since the present form of government went into effect in Negaunce, it is the growing lack of interest in municipal affairs on the part of local resi-

Granted, Negaunce in five years has come from an "in the red" total of \$160,000 to an "in the black" bank balance. More improvements have been made than ever before, more equipmen edded, and taxes have been lowered - not raised. These accomplishments are the result of excellent work on the part of the Councli and the fact Negaunce has been blessed with top rate manag-

Nevertheless, it is alarming to see the number of voters on election day decline each year. If it continues a minority will be numing our representatives on the city governing body and this would be most unfortunate. It is not only the privilege - but the duty - of every good citizen to vote Monday.

cosions in the last few months when the electric system was out Knights Hike Lead of order temporarily had a fire broken out with no power available for pumping purposes. With a storage tank the stand-by supply of In Cribbage Loop several hundred thousand gallons would be available by gravity flow. In addition, by utilizing the tank during minimum consumption periods during the early morning hours, pumps could be shut off, thereby resulting in a considerable saving in power purchased

by the community, The school proposal also indicates sound planning for the future. The growth in population trend is toward the twonship districts, they are already sending more than 300 pupils to Negaunce each day, and a movement is now underway to eliminate tuition funds by the state, which would throw the burden of paying for these students entirely on the township districts. In this event, they would undoubtedly crect their own facilities and the Negaune Public School system would lose this revenue entirely. By annexation, this tuition loss could be compensated for by the fact that millage levied for school purposes in the township would be turned into the treasurery of the single district,

Here Are The Facts On The SCHOOL ANNEXATION PROPOSAL

(Annexation of Negaunee and Richmond Township School Districts to the City of Negaunee School District No. 1)

Presented Herewith Are Factors Involved In The Proposal And Answers To Questions Already Asked

ADVANTAGES OF ANNEXATION

- 1. Negaunee is the Community Cers ter of All Three School Districts. 2. Business and traffic flow towards
- the School Center.
- 3. Children of these three Communities would receive equal opportunities by being offered the same Education Program.
- 4. The more children there are enrolled in a school system, the smaller is the cost per pupil.
- 5. It will provide a greater valuation base in the event future expansion of the school plant becomes neces-
- 6. If annexation does not occur and the township school districts are required to erect buildings, it will mean, with their limited tax base. a levy of about 25 mills for 30 years on Negaunee industries located in these districts. This would be 12 mills more than the present tax levy for schools in Ne-
- 7. If more buildings are needed in No. have a valuation of \$25,000,000. and the construction would re-
- quire a levy of about only one mil? 8. To maintain a Class B High School in Negaunee annexation is necessary, for if the township school districts no longer enrolled their children here. Negaunee would slip back to a Class C School. This . happened in another Upper Peninsula school this year.
- 9 Enrollment of Township students elsewhere would cost the Negari nee system \$60,000 in tuition or 1 membership funds

- 10. Tuition paid by the township districts does not now help to defray expenses for new buildings of maintenance of present facilities. If annexed, these districts will pay their share of this cost.
- Annexation should not increase the Negaunee School Tax Rate.
- 12. Annexation would erase the feeling of a difference in identity and give representation to people in township districts, who are now sending their children to school in Negaunee.
- 13. Annexation will provide a better transportation system for school

DISADVANTAGES OF THE PROPOSAL

- 1. One of the Township school districts has already approached the State Department of Public, Instruction regarding steps that must be taken toward construction of its own school.
- This district has a valuation of \$1. 500,000 and the construction of the school building would require a minimum of 10 additional mills. The tax levy now is approximately 15 mills. This district now sends 207 students to Negaunee, Ten years ago the same district was sending 30 students. This could be a financial disadvantage to that district, to any resident from Negaunee owning property in that district, and also to the City of Negaunee.
- Through Annexation Negaunee would lose its present tuition revenue, but this would partially be offset by increased state aid for membership, and the broader tax

- base. However, there is now a movement underway to eliminate state aid for tuition purposes, which has the support of state organizations.
- 4. There will probably be an initial loss in revenue derived by the Ne-gaunee School System, but this will be offset by present balances in treasuries in township school districts.

OTHER FACTORS INVOLVED

- Board of Education members would be elected at large in the single school district, thereby giving township residents a vote in selection of the Negaunee School Board
- All shool property under annexa-tion would become part of the common property of the district.
- 3. All school personnel now employed would continue under contract. This program did not originate
- with the local administrator or Board of Education. It is the problem of all three districts, and the movement to reduce school districts is advocated by the State Legislature and Michigan Department of Public Instruction. 5. Michigan Laws do not require that
- this proposal be submitted to a vote of Negaunee residents. However, it is probably the most important step under consideration in the history of the Negaunee Public Schools and the Board of Education is deeply concerned, and recognizing its responsibility to the people, very earnestly desires to obtain the opinion of the


