Prior to her illness she had been active in the Negaunee Women's Club and the Wawonowin Golf Club

Survivors include one son, William G., Winnetka, Ill., and two sisters, Mrs. Cumile Mans d Miss Ida Suess, both of Milwaukee; two grandchildren, Peter and Karen, Winnetka,
