TOWNSHIP BUDGET MEETING HELD

At a meeting held Sat. at the Elementary School, resolutions were adopted approving the annual budget for the next year of some \$36,000. Only nine taxpayers were on hand for this meeting besides the Township Board. A motion was approved to ask the County Tax Allocation Board for one mill to cover the cost of this budget, which is set up to finance the operating expenses of the township. A copy of the proposed budget will be printed at a later date.

A request from the White Pine Fire Department for \$400 to cover car expenses, association dues and meetings, etc. was tabled pending a decision as to the legality of the request. It was noted that the White Pine Fire Department had been called to several fires in the township during the past several months with no cost to the township.

For the benefit of those who are not aware of Township Board meeting dates, we wish to advise that meetings are held the first Wednesday of each month at the Town Hall in Green, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

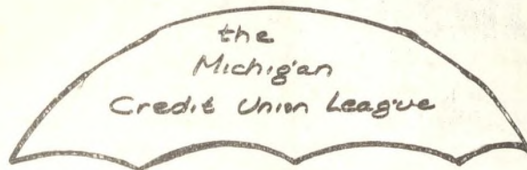
