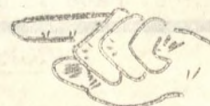

It was just a little over two years ago when these signals were beamed to the White Pine, Silver City and Green areas. Perhaps most of you remember that evening. We recall that the phones were buzzing almost as loud as the TV sets and, most of all, that sigh of relief when it finally appeared that this system was really going to work.

All of this would not have been possible had it not been for the faith and support given by the residents in this area. The solicitation at that time for members to our project was nearly 100%. Since that time, many of the new residents have also contributed their \$25 for a family membership fee to this cause. The support of all residents in this area is needed, and those who have not joined are requested to do so. The cost of membership is \$25 and annual dues of \$1 have been set by the Board of Directors. This can be sent to the PORKIE MTS. TV COMPANY, INC. C/O W. L. Evans, Secretary-Treasurer at White Pine, Michigan. Company employees can arrange a payroll deduction by contacting W. L. Evans.

This system is known as the TRANSLATOR system. In our case, we pick up the signals for Channels 3 and 6 out of Duluth and rebroadcast (or translate) these stations on Channels 7 and 9. This system is licensed by the Federal Communication System and any one in the area of our radiated signal can receive these channels.

The White Pine Lions Club was, and is continuing, to sponsor this project. However, a non-profit corporation, Porkie Mts. TV Company Inc. was formed to build and operate the television system. The transmitting tower is located about 1 mile west of the Porcupine Mountain ski hill. The system cost a little over \$22,000 and the annual cost of maintenance is about \$3000.

This cost is being financed by membership subscriptions and dues to the Porkie Mts. TV Company, Inc., and by contributions from the Lions Club from its vending machine operations. A loan of \$14,000 was secured from Copper Range Company to provide installation funds. Loan repayments totaling \$5,500 have been made leaving a balance of \$8,500 still due Copper Range Company.

An annual meeting of the members of the Porkie Mts. TV Company is scheduled for April 22, 1964. This will be held at 6:00 p.m. at the Elementary School in White Pine. All members and new members are requested to attend. It will be a good chance for you to learn more about your TV company.
