SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

3

March 16, 1964

The regular monthly meeting of the White Pine School District Board of Education was held in the White Pine Elementary School. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by B. Laurence Richmond, President.

The following members were in attendance: B. Laurence Richmond, Lawrence Garfield, Harry W. Banbury, M. June Aho, Lewis Johnson, Richard Trudgeon, and Lydia Jones. Also attending was Superintendent W. J. Niemi, Jr., Mr. Irving Bolo, Green, Michigan, and Mr. Bernard J. Byrnes, Silver City, Michigan.

Mr. Irving Bolo was recognized and presented his views on school taxes and budgets. Mr. Byrnes presented his views on getting information to the public regarding school matters. Since the Board of Education had previously discussed the publication of minutes, and had felt that a newspaper with school district wide coverage would be best for getting information to the general public, it unanimously supported a motion by M. June Aho that the Board of Education publish the minutes of its meetings and the financial report in the NONESUCH NEWS. The motion was supported by Lydia Jones. Roll Call: B. L. Richmond, J. Aho, L. Garfield, R. Trudgeon, H. W. Banbury, L. Johnson, and L. Jones. 7 ayes, motion carried.

It was moved by L. Garfield that the minutes of the previous meeting, and the Special Meeting of March 2, 1964, be approved as presented, supported by M. J. Aho. 7 ayes, motion carried.

It was moved by R. Trudgeon, and supported by L. Jones, that the treasurer's report be approved as read. 7 ayes, motion carried.

It was moved by L. Garfield, and supported by L. Jones, that we pay the bills of the month starting with voucher #3542 through #3585, including voucher #3538, total amount \$18,354.32. Roll call: B. L. Richmond, M. J. Aho, L. Garfield, R. Trudgeon, L. Johnson, H. W. Banbury, L. Jones. 7 ayes, motion carried.

School lunch report for February 1964 was unanimously approved. Supt. Niemi recommended that the charge for adult lunches be reviewed and raised in the coming year.

It was moved by L. Garfield that the Board accept the 1964-65 Preliminary Budget on Expenditures as modified, and supported by L. Jones. 7 ayes, motion carried.

It was moved by J. Aho that we accept the Revenue Budget, and supported by L. Garfield. Roll Call: B. L. Richmond, J. Aho, L. Garfield, H. W. Banbury, R. Trudgeon, L. Johnson and L. Jones. 7 ayes. Motion carried.

It was moved by L. Jones that the Board accept the School Calendar for 1964-65 as presented by Supt. Niemi, and supported by J. Aho. 7 ayes, motion carried.

It was moved by L. Garfield, and supported by H. Banbury, that the Board finds the professional employees' salary guide for 1964-65 satisfactory; 7 ayes, motion carried.

Action on the non-professional salary and benefits was tabled for the April meeting.

The Annual Library Board Budget was presented, requesting from the Board of Education the sum of \$1,000.00 as the School District's share for the Township Library expenditures. It was moved by R. Trudgeon that the Board will allot \$1,000.00 to the Township Library, supported by L. Jones. Roll Call: B. L. Richmond, L. Garfield, M. J. Aho, R. Trudgeon, L. Johnson, H. W. Banbury, L. Jones; 7 ayes, motion carried.

It was moved by L. Jones that we supplement the School Lunch Fund by the sum of \$1,000.00 from the General School Fund, supported by M. J. Aho. Roll Call: B. L. Richmond, June Aho, L. Garfield, R. Trudgeon, L. Johnson, H. W. Banbury, Lydia Jones; 7 ayes, motion carried.

Supt. Niemi recommends: No changes in coaching salaries; additional compensation for extra-curricular activities such as - cheer leading squad; producing the school annual; producing the class play; and allow expense money for the M.E.A. (State approved) convention.

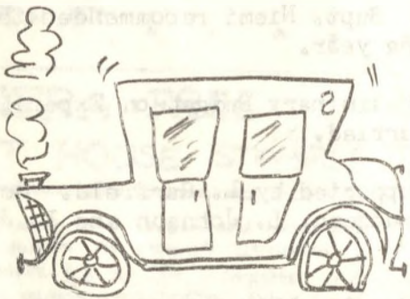
Supt. Niemi also recommends sight and hearing programs every year.
