MINING MATTERS.

CHEERING NEWS.

There is a diversity of opinion as to the amount of the silver in the Bohemian mine. We have received the cheering intelligence that work is to be resumed at the Bohemian mine. Arrangements have been perfected by which a new name will be given to the property, and work commenced on the opening of navigation. We hope to be able to give further particulars in detail shortly. Everything about the mine is in good shape to commence operations. There are some 40 good workings upon the location capable of accommodating a large force. They have the tools and steel outfit for 80 miners, all the hoists and cars also in good order, and their stamp mill belonging to the mine. Their stamp mill is also in good order, and their machinery. All the machinery has been well taken care of. They have also an excellent Saw Mill capable of saving several thousand feet of lumber per day, and also the great desideratum for a mine, the copper. We all remember how surprised we were to hear that the Bohemian had stopped, and we think we are safe in saying that no mine in Ontonagon county appeared so well prepared to have a brighter future before it than the Bohemian, in proof of which we will state that during the last three months that the mine worked they produced nearly a half ton of copper for each ton of silver. The Bohemian will pay under prudent and judicious management to person at all acquainted with the nature of the vein can doubtless find an outlet for their silver, and the Bohemian may be able to sustain the high opinion we have always entertained of the property.

The tributors that are working on the property now are making good wages, despite the disadvantages they labor under, and are taking out some good samples of copper.

ABOUT \$100,000 of this stock will be offered at the West and the balance to Eastern parties at par. The company adopts this course with a view to early sales so that the smelting works may be commenced immediately, as there are no works now built capable of smelting the product of this mine alone after it gets so far opened as to enable a large force to work at once.

This project is not gotten up as a balloon enterprise. It is as far developed as to warrant the owners in the belief that at a cost of \$1,500,000 the profits are likely to far exceed any enterprise of the kind.

The company will have their constitutions amended so that the mine will be under the supervision of E. B. Ward of this city.

Recognizing its greater and growing importance to the commercial interest of the Northwest and the necessity for its enlargement Congress at its last session, appropriated \$150,000 for the improvement of the St. Marys River Canal. The kind of improvement to be made, and the expenditure on the appropriation, were placed by the War Department in the hands of Major O. M. Poe, of the Engineer Corps, United States Army. In this report Major Poe says the new work recommended is of magnitude quite equivalent to the original work of constructing the present canal, and will practically double its capacity.

It is contemplated to deepen the canal so as to increase the depth of water four feet, or about three and one-half feet deeper than at present; to change the present sloping side-walls, and make them nearly vertical, by which means the width of the canal will be increased nearly fifty per cent; to construct an additional set of locks on the south side of those now used, and at the head of each set of locks to construct guard locks, to avoid interruption of navigation whenever either lock is not in condition to be used.

The appropriation already made will be devoted to the upper end of the canal, removing the guard gates from their present position to a point 700 feet nearer the head of the canal, and bringing the improvement of the prism from the head of the canal down to include the new guard gates. Contracts have been made for this work, to be completed before the opening of navigation in the spring of the present year. The engineer in charge has asked from Congress an additional appropriation of \$500,000 for the next year.

PORTAGE LAKE AND SUPERIOR SHIP CANAL. By an act of Congress, approved March 3, 1865, the right was conferred upon the State of Michigan to locate and construct a boatmaker, harbor, and ship canal, to connect the waters of Lake Superior with those of Portage Lake; and for the purpose of aiding in constructing and completing these works, 200,000 acres of public lands were granted to the State.

On the 18th of the same month the Legislature of the State accepted the grant, and conferred the lands upon the Portage Lake and Lake Superior Ship Canal Company, upon conditions and with privileges provided in Act No. 216 of 1865. By a subsequent act of Congress, approved July 3, 1865, a second grant of 200,000 acres was made for the same purpose, and this was accepted by the State in Act No. 405, Session Laws of 1867.

By comparing the Act of Congress conferring upon the State the first 200,000 acres for this canal, with the act approved August 25, 1852, granting land to the State to aid in the construction of the St. Marys Fall Ship Canal, it will be seen that the grants in both cases were made in almost precisely the same form and words, and for

the same general purposes viz, the construction of the great public works, by means of public lands, for the public benefit. It will be seen from the reports of the officers of the company, that the 400,000 acres of land selected by their agents include many of the pine and oak lands in the Upper Peninsula, and estimated at every great value. These lands, by the terms of the Act of the Legislature, will be "free of any tax for the term of four years" from the time of the acceptance of the canal, and so long held by said company.

Although this work of great importance to the business interests of the Northwest, and especially to that of Lake Superior, is being constructed at the public cost, the company upon whom the lands were conferred claim that they are not contractors for the construction of a public work, but that until completion of the canal they will become not only absolute owners of the 400,000 acres of land, but of the canal itself. The only ground upon which their claim is based, is the peculiar language of certain sections of Act No. 216, Session Laws of 1855.

Whatever may have been the intention of the Legislature as regards the ownership of the canal, it is very clear as to the right and duty of the Legislature to regulate and determine the tolls to be received for the use of the canal and harbor, and also to cause the same to be as necessary to be applied to the improvement and preservation of the same in such manner as it may prescribe.

The engineer appointed by the company to supervise the work in behalf of the State, reports a very large amount of work as having been done during the last two years, and expresses the hope that the canal may be completed and opened to the commerce of the lakes during the present year. This report will be placed before you.

GEOLOGICAL SURVEY.

The Legislature of 1869 made provision for resuming the geological survey of the State, and the annual appropriation was required to be expended in the Upper Peninsula, and the remaining half in the Lower.

The State Geological Board, under whose supervision the work was to be prosecuted, and appropriations expended, appointed as Director of Survey, Prof. Alexander Winchell, who had filled the same position in the geological investigations of former years. The Director immediately entered upon his discharge of his duties; detailed plans for a complete and thorough geological exploration of the whole State were made, and two corps of assistants were sent to the Peninsula, and the reports of the survey have been forwarded to the State Geologist, and the result of the researches already made, and the work accomplished, will far more than justify the expenditure. The survey has indicated the existence of a valuable region underlying thirteen townships, and has yielded much other useful information. The value of these investigations and researches is of a permanent character, and not confined to any one section or interest of the State.

The reports of Prof. Winchell will be laid before you, and will be found full of interest. It also contains a carefully prepared estimate of the cost of properly completing this important work, and understanding the State, respectfully submit to your consideration, whether it may not be advisable somewhat to increase the annual appropriation for this purpose, rather than to report the survey for several years.

No provision was made in the act of 1869 for printing or publishing the documents or reports which might be made from time to time.

For information on this subject, I refer you to the report of the Director. These reports will be of service so far as published. I recommend that the State Geological Board be authorized to publish these reports when prepared by the Director, and that proper appropriations be made therefor.
