

Louis C. Vasseur

In 1863 he enlisted in Company B
27th Michigan Vo. Inf. at Marquette and
served with his company in all of its
campaigns and engagements.

In the battle ~~xxxx~~ before Plattsburg when
the fort was blown up, he was dangerously ~~xxx~~
wounded and was thereafter confined in
the hospital at St. David's Island until
receiving his honorable discharge on
account of physical disability in February ~~18~~
1865. Mr. Vasseur immediately came to
Ontonagon to visit a brother and with the
exception of the following year which he
spent in Greenbay he has since resided in
this place.

Mr. Vasseur was one of the very few veterans
of the Civil War remaining in Ontonagon. He
was known, loved and respected by
all men, women and children of the village
and his passing is regretted by all.

Louis b. Vasseur was of French & Indian blood. born at Georgian Bay Canada in 1839. He came to Ont. in the early 1850's. his occupation was commercial fisherman.

He enlisted in the Union Army & served in the inf. throughout the war 1861-65. Sharpshooter. He was one of very few who returned to Ont. after the C.W. He was wounded in service had a silver plate in his head & a crippled leg.
