Tauno Hannikainen **Conducts Sinfonietta** Here.

The first assembly program of the current school year will be a musical program by the National, Women's Sinfonietta, conducted by Tauno Hannikainen, on Wednes-day, October 6 at 8 P. M. in the

college auditorium.

Tauno Hannikainen comes from a long line of musicians. His father was a distinguished composer and music teacher, a master of theory and a gifted violinist. Three of his brothers are well known musicians with the Helsinki Symphony Or

with the Heisinit Symphony Orheestra. Tatuno, with two of his
brothers formed an outstanding
musical trio and were soon very
popular in Northern Europe Later,
Tauno attracted attention as a conductor and soon he was having
guest appearances with orchestras
in Berlin, Stockholm, Warsaw, Heisinik, Riga, Leipig and other cities.
News of his successes reached the
United States and he was invited
to come here. Mr. Hannikainen has
proved to be a very brilliant conductor in several guest appearances throughout the United States
and is at present conductor of the
National Women's Sinfonletts and
assistant conductor of the Chicago
Symphony Orchestra.

The Women's Symphony of Chicago was founded in 1925 and since
that time has had a brilliant history in the music field. For more
than a score of years the Women's
Symphony has given a series of
concerts each season in Orchestra
Hall and played on the summer
series in Grant Park, At the time
of the Century of Progress, it was
one of the musical attractions and
in 1933 the orchestra was chosen to
play at the Chicago Stadium before
an audience of 20,000 to honor Madame Kai-shek. A few years ago
