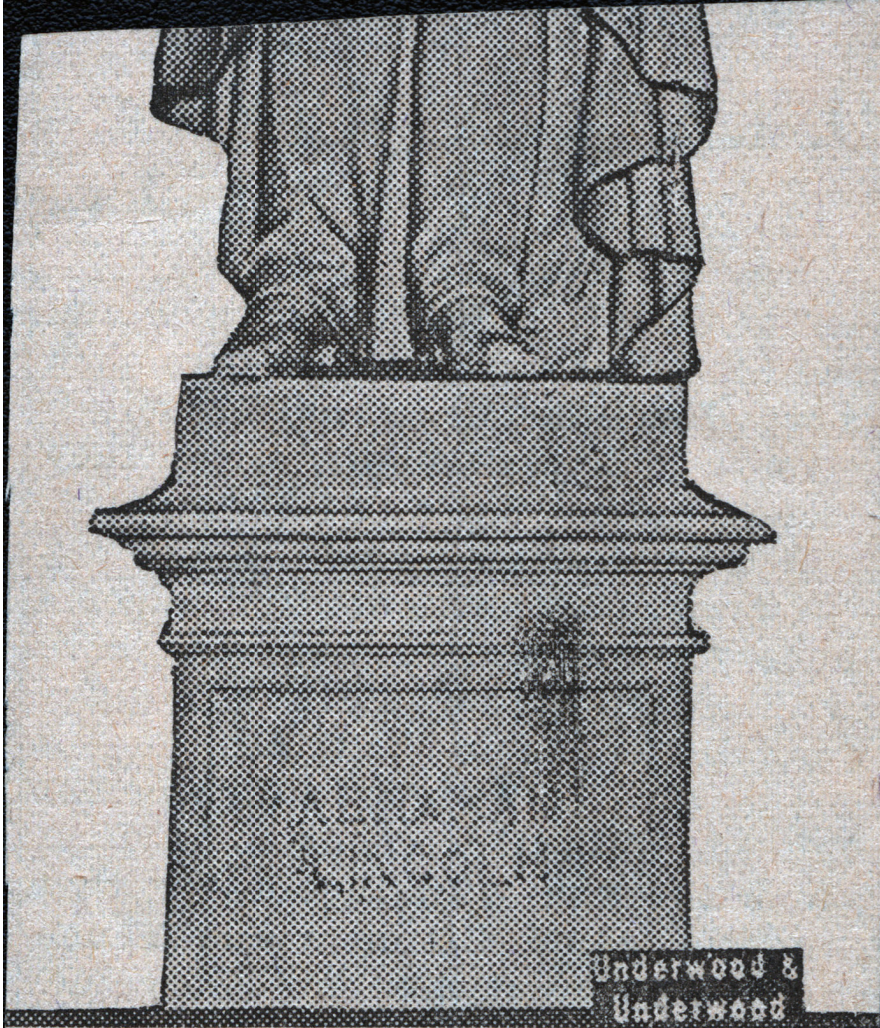

the statue." So Flannery's statue was taken down and stored away and most people of all sense hoped it would be kept there. Others who had an affection for the statue as a landmark and as the first attempt to put Lincoln in bronze or marble protested. There was a hearing before a congressional committee and the result was that the statue was restored to its original position before the court house, although it is mounted on a lower pedestal.

Washington also has another famous Lincoln statue which stands in the rotunda of the Capitol. It was made by Vinnie Ream, a twenty-year-old girl from Wisconsin who went to Washington to study art and took a position as a clerk in the Post Office department at \$600 a year to support herself and her father. Clark Mills, the sculptor who made the famous "rocking chair" statue of Andrew Jackson, was the one who suggested that a young girl should be chosen to make the statue of Lincoln.
