(ME) I'm at the Home of Helen Solka in

NATIONAL MINE THE DATE IS DECEMBER 29TH

1983, THURS DAY, WERE, WHERE AND WHEN WERE YOU BORN?

(MS) I WAS BORN IN NATIONAL MINE, IN AH, 1913, 50 ILL BE 71 years old ah, 8th of FEBRUARY.

(ME) could you Tell me a little about your childhood, or?

my CHILD HOOD? Well, WHATH AHH, I was born on a my GRANDMA'S House And we had a they called it a farm, but it wasn't a farm like the big farms are, we had horses and Chicken and cows and pigs of Coarse, and I LIVED THERE UNTIL I WAS 8 years old, THEN A WE MOVED WALKED TO SCHOOL FROM THERE, I REMEMBER WALKING REMEMBER ONE VALENTINES day I LOST ALL MY UNLENTINES, WALK THROUGH THE SNOW, THERE WAS SO MUCH SNOW AND I HAD lost my valentines on THE WAY HOME.

DO You Remember the day of the stock MARKET CRASH?

(MS) NO, I DON'T REMEMBER TO MUCH ABOUT THAT.

(ME) DO YOU REMEBER WHEN YOU FIRST HEARD ABOUT IT, OK

(MS) NO, I DON'T ... I HAVE NO IDEA.

(ME) WHAT DID YOU THINK OF PRESIDENT HOOVER?

(MS) I DON'T REMEMBER TOO MUCH OF HIS PRESIDENCY.

ME) WHAT ABOUT FRANKLIN ROOSEVELT?

(MS) WELL, FRANKLIN ROOSEVELT, I REMEMBER HIM... SITTING BY (ONE)
THE FIRE PLACE AND GIVING THE DIFFERENT ACHATS OVER THE T.V., OR OVER THE RADIO AND, AND A , OF COARSE IN THOSE DAYS WE DIDN'T HAVE T, V. LIKE WE HAVE NOW, WE ONLY HAD THE RADIOS AND, WE HAD A LITTLE TO CROSSLY RADIO THAT HAD BAT... BIG BATTERY IN THE BACK OF IT AND THAT'S WHAT WE USED TO LISTEN TO ALL THE

(ME) "INTERUPT" DID YOU ...?

(MS) ... NEWS AND EVERYTHING, CAME THROUGH ...

(ME) DID YOU OWN YOUR OUN RADIO OR DID YOU HAVE TO GO AND ...?

(MS) WE HAD OUR O... WE HAD OUR FAMILY RADIO. IN THOSE DAYS KIDS NEVER HAD RADIO LIKE THEY DID KNOW.

(ME) was your father employed?

(M3) I DON'T ENER REMEMBER MY DAD NOT WORKING. HE WORKED Part Lime, a few times and He was a night watch man at the at the TILDEN MINE, WHEN THE TILDER MINE OPENED FIRST, THAT WAS MIANY, MANY Years ago, THAT WAS, OH I WAS JUST A YOUNG THEN IN HIGH SCHOOL AND HE WAS WORKING At the tilden mine and.

(ME) was He ever laid off or anything?

(MS) NOT THAT I CAN REMEMBER. NO, IT SEEMS LIKE HE ALWAYS HAD SOME KIND OF A JOB, Well, I REMEMBER OUR ONCE..., WHEN I WAS IN HIGH SCHOOL, HE went and worked ahh... In L'anse for Henry FORD. He was laid off at that time from the mine and then he went to work for Henry FORD IN L'anse. AND AHH... THEN HE CAME BACK HERE AGAIN AND GOT BACK INTO THE MINE, AGAIN AND THAT'S ARE WHEN HE WORKED AT THE TILDEN MINE

(ME) DO YOU REMEMBER, PRETTY MUCH, OR, DO YOU REMEMBER PRYTHING ABOUT, FROM THE DEPRESSION, DURING THE DEPRESSION?

(ME) AND IF YOU HAD HARD TIMES? OR ...

(MS) It WAS, IE WAS KIND OF HARD.

(ME) IF YOUR FAMILY HAD TO GO WITHOUT SUPPER SOME DAY? (MS) NO! I DON'T EVER REMEMBER EVER BEING HUNGRY, NOT

ONCE IN MY WHOLE LIFE DO I EVER REMEMBER OF EVER BEING

(ME) DID YOUR FAMILY EVER LOSE MONEY, LIKE ... WHEN THE DAY DANKS CLOSED, CR ...

(MS) NOT THAT I KNOW OF , WHH, WHH! NO

(ME) WERE THERE ANY REAL BIG BANKS AROUND HERE THAT

(MS) NOT THAT I KNOW OF . NO. I DON'T EVER REMEMBER OF THE BANKS CLOSING HERE.

(ME) WHAT ABOUT YOUR FRIENDS, DO YOU REMEMBER OF THEM HAVING A HARD TIME, OR ANY THING ?

(MS) WELL THERE WERE SOME People THAT HAD IT HARD, BUT TUM, , , , WE WERE FORTUNATE ENOUGH TO HAVE A MOTHER AND FATHER THAT WERE KIND OF ON THE SAVING SIDE, AND WHEN THERE WAS WORK THEY DID SAVE SOTHAT WE WOULD HAVE SOMETHING TO FALL BACK ON, YOU KNOW, AND THERE, OF COARSE THEY ALWAYS PLANTED A GARDEN 50, SUMMER TIME THEY D PREPARE FOR THE WINITER, AND PRESERVE EVERY THING THEY COULD PRESERVE AND, BERRIES, AN, JAMS AND JELLIES, AN, PICKLES AND THINGS LIKE THAT ... YUP

(ME) WHAT DID YOU DO FOR ENTERTAINMENT?

(MS) FOR ENTERTAINMENT (OCOUS) WELL,

(ME) (INTERUPT) DID YOU GO TO MOVIES?

(MS) WE MADE SKIPPERS IF YOU KNOW WHAT SKIPPERS ARE,

WE TAKE A , A BARREL , TAKE A BARREL AND KNOCK IT APART, KNOCK THE RINGS OFF OF IT AN, AND TAKE A BLOCK OF WOOD AND NAIL IN THE CENTER OF ONE ATHE BARREL STABES THAT CAME OUT OF THE BARREL AND PUT A PIECE OF WOOD ACROSS THE TOP OF THAT BLOCK OF WOOD AN, AND WE USED THEM TO RIDE ON, AND THEN WE USED TO RIDE IN, OLD DISH PAN, IF WE COULD FIND AN OLD DISH PAN, WE'DO RIDE THAT, AND PIECES AF CARDBOARD WE RODE ON, WE DIDN'T HAVE very much as far as TOBAGANS AND THINGS LIKE THAT, SO UNTIL WE WERE OLDER. THINGS WERE (ME) HOW WERE, HOW, HOW OLD WERE YOU DOING THE 30's, WHEN THE DEPRESSION WAS, WERE YOU JUST A LITTKE GIRL, CR? (MS) I DON'T REMEMBER JUST EXACTLY. HOW, WHAT YEAR Was (ME) 30, ABOUT 19305, 33 (MS) I THINK I MUST HAVE BEEN, I MUST HAVE BEEN IN HIGH SCHOOL. 1930 WHAT, DID YOU SAY? (ME) AROUND '33 ABOUT 50 years dago, (MS) '33? 1933, I WAS MARRIED AT THAT TIME (LAUGHS) Ha. Ha, Hann (ME) AROUND TO THE 20'S SOMEWHERE ... (MS) I THINK I CAN REMEBER PART NOW WHEN YOU SAY THE YEAR THAT IT WAS, I WAS MARRIED AT THAT TIME, AND MY Husband worked at the, um, MATHER INN FOR A FEW., JUST FOR A FEW MONTHS AND THEN HE WAS OFF AND THEN, HE, THEN AH, WPA CAME IN, THAT WAS DURING THE DEPRESSION, WE HAD THE WPA. SO HE WORKED WPA; WAR, NIGHT WATCH MAN. AND SOMETIMES HE WORKED DAY SHIFT TOO, (DAY HE WAS LEAVING)"?" AND I HAD THREE SMALL & CHIL DREN AT THAT TIME. WELL GOING, WE HAD TO ... SQUEEZEOUR PENNIFS AND MA

THEM, TO MAKE THEM, YOU KNOW, GO FOR AND THEN WE HAD, AH, DIFFERENT THINGS FROM THE GOVERNMENT, THE GOVERNMENT, THE GOVERNMENT GAVE OUT BUTTER, AN, JUST LIKE THEY ARE DOING NOW..., MAN

(m) CHeese? -

(MS) THEY GAVE OUT BUTTER AN, I DON'T KNOW ABOUT., NOT TOO MUCH CHEESE, BUT BACON. I REMEMBER GETTING BACON. AND BUTTER AN... BEANS, AN RICE, AN S, THINGE, DRY FOODS,

(ME) WHAT WERE THE PRICES LIKE, WERE THEY DIFFERENT THAN

(ms) Yes, THEY WERE DIFFERENT BUT THE WAGES WERENT HIGH THEN EITHER, THEY USED TO WORK FOR \$3.75 a day. BUTTER WAS \$15, \$20 cents a pound, AND HAMBURGER, USED TO GET THREE POUNDS OF HAMBURGER FOR A Quarter.

(ME) DID THE PRICES SEEM HIGH, LIKE?

(MS) It DID SEEM HIGH THEN BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, THE WAGES WERE SO/CITTLE. BUT I DON'T KNOW IF WE WERE HAPPIER THEN, THAN WE ARE NOW. I THINK THE WAY People are now, THEY WANT TOO MUCH. YOU KNOW, THEY MADE, MORE MONEY, THE MORE MONEY THEY MAKE THE MORE THEY WANT.

(ME) DID You Have an automobile in those Days? A car?

MS) Not atfirst we didn't. WE WERE, WE DIDN'T HAVE AN AUTOMOBICE, I DON'T THINK UNTIL WE WERE, ARE CHILDREN WERE QUITE BIG REFORE WE GOT A CAR, I we, THEY MUST HAVE BEEN ABOUT TO 8 YEARS old, I think my daughter must have been 10 years old before we bought our for the children, and, automobiles didn't bother us that much a Home my brother-in-laws had automobiles so, they used to pick us up. And them we had a taxi, that ran from ishpeming to ishpeming, and a, it would be a Quarter to go down and a Quarter to come back. I remember that much about It.

ME) DID YOU Have to walk every where then?

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(MS) Yes, I WALKED BACK AND FORTH TO ISHPEMING, MANY, MANY
TIME, SOMETIMES TWICE and THREE TIME A WEEK, COARSE, WE AKWAYS
HAD A STORE HERE IN NATIONAL MINE, AND IT WAS CALLED ANALA'S
STORE AT THAT TIME, AND A THEN ERNEL AND SOLKA HAD A STORE
HERE IN NATIONAL MINE TOO, AND WE DID, WERE, DID BUY MOST
OF OUR GROCERIES FROM THOSE TWO STORES, THEY HAD FRESH
MEET AND, ALL THE VEGETABLES WE COULD Get, YOU KNOW.

(ME) WAS BIGGER THAN IT IS TODAY?

(MS) NO, THEY'RE A, THE STORE IS ALMOST THE SAME AS IT WAS WHEN, I WAS YOUNGER , I REMEMBER ANALA'S STORE EVER SINCE I WAS LITTLE, Ha, Ha, Ha, Ha, Ha.

(ME) HOW IMPORTANT WAS THE AUTOMOBILE, WAS IT REALLY IMPORTANT OR, WAS IT JUST LIKE?

(MS) It was a luxury in one way, Because we didn't Ago very far, we didn't make very many long trips. The only thing we used the car for would be to go back and forth to Ishpeming.

AND THEN TO CHURCH, MOSTLY, we, AND THEN, OF COARSE, ONCE IN A GREAT WHILE, WE WOULD GO TO A BASKETBALL GAME, IF THERE WAS A BASKET BALL GAME, IF THERE WAS WE DIDN'T TAKE ANY LONG TRIPS IN OUR CAR WITH OUR CAR UNTILL.

(ME) WHAT WERE THE STORESLIKE AROUND HERE, WERE THERE

(MS) YOU MEAN IN ISHPEMING?

(ME) LIKE ATP, LIKE THESE KIND, WERE, WERE THERE AND, OR WERE THEY SUST LIKE FAMILY STORE, OR? LIKE, WERE THEY BIG CHAIN STORE, LIKE IN CHAINS, LIKE ATP?

(MS) NC, UH, UH, THE STORES WERENT MUCH DIFFERENT THEN THEY
ARE RIGHT NOW, ISHPEMANG HASNIT CHANGED THAT MUCH, AND
NATIONAL MINE HASNIT, REALLY, EITHER, ONLY THAT THE PEOPLE HAB
HAUE, THERE'S ALOT OF PEOPLE IN NATIONAL MINE THAT I DON'T ANY
MORE NOW, THEN.

- (ME) DID YOU HAVE TO ORDER THERE EVERYTHING POR, WAS THERE SOME, OR AT LEAST ONE STORE YOU COULD GO AND QBUY?
- (ms) well we used to go to the ... THEY CALLED THE DIME STORE. AT THAT, OR FIVE Y TEN, AT THAT TIME, WE DID GO THERE TO BUT AKOT OF SMALL THINGS, BUT THEY NEVER HAD ANYTHING TOO BIG, IT WAS MORE OR LESS LITTLE THINGS, YOU KNOW. (CLEHRS THROAT)
- (ME) WHET WERE THERE ANY BIG CLUBS AROUND HERE? LIKE THE LIONS OR ?
- 1 ms) Well, THEY HAD A, THE ELKS WERE STILL A FORMED, AN THEN THEKE WHS THE MOOSE, AND THE SONS OF SAINT GEORGE, AND A, THAT'S THE ONLY ONES I CAN REMEMBER, MY DAD WAS THE MEMBER OF THE SON OF SHINT GEORGE. PIY Husband never belonged to any club at all. AND I NEVER DID EITHER. Just a birthday club, AND THAT WAS Just a family more or LESS.
- (ME) WHAT ABOUT, WERE THERE REAL BIG RESTAURANTS AKOUND HERE
- (MS) THERE WAS NEUER A RESTAURANT IN NIATIONAL MINE THAT I COULD KEMEMBER OF.
- (ME) WHAT ABOUT IN ISHPENING?
- (MS) WELL , ISHPEMING 15, THERE WAS UM. THERE WERE MORE KESTAURANTS, THERE HRE MORE RESTAURANTS KNOW THEN THERE WERE BEFORE IN SHfeming, Because, it seems like there's Everyone come to IsHpeming from all the outside PLACES, THAT THEY HAVE CARS TO GET THERE, now, You know, Jo,
- (ME) WHAT, DID YOU ever travel on the railroad? was the railroad a big thing in those days.
- (MS) DID I EVER RIDE?
- (ME) I mean was it a a real big thing? THE RHICROHD
- (MS) OH, Yeah, THE TRAIN USED TO COME TO NATIONAL MINE, I REMEMBER ONCE I WENT TO MARQUETTE ON THE

TRAIN. IT CAME OUT AND AH, WE GOT ON THE BY THE OLD POST OFFICE IN National MINE. THE TRAIN CAME THAT FAR, ON THE TR, AND A PICKED EVERYBODY UP FROM THE CHURCH. AND THE CHURCH WENT TO PRESK THE ILE FOR A PICKNICK. AND WE WENT ON THE TRAIN AN We all thought that was something special. BECAUSE I Remember that, I couldn't have been much more THAN 8 or 10 years old. I can still remember.

- (ME) COULD YOU REMEMBER WHEN THE LAST PASENGER TRAIN WAS IN ISHPEMING?
- (MS) NO, that'S, THAT'S QUITE A FEW Year ago, I can't evacely remember. But I DID TAKE THE HOC OUT OF ISHPEINING ONE TIME, AND I went DOWN TO WISCONSIN FOR A FUNERAL, BUT THAT WAS THE ONLY TIME I ROAD ON THE 400,
- (ME) were there any major layoffs that you remember, like in the mines of schools or, STRIKES OR ANYTHING?

IMS) ANY WHAT?

(ME) HAY MAJOR LAYOFF OR STRIKES?

(MS) THEY HAD A BIG STRIKE Here ah I can't remember the exact year, But THAT.

(ME) was it 1946 or something?

(MS) I THINK SO, Yeah that was a real big strike then, THEY were off for MANY MONTHS.

(ME) was that for the MINES?

(MS) THAT WAS for the MINES, year humum, year, THERE WAS A LOT OF HARD FEELINGS, THERE WAS a Shooting. THERE WAS a MAN THAT WAS SHOT. AND A, I was on THE PICKIT LINE WITH MY Husband. I'm not ashamed to say it. I sayed if you're going on the PICKIT LINE, I'm Going with you, If you're going to get shot I'm going to get shot, I told him. I says you're not going to go and leave me with the KIDS. So I went with, on the PICKIT LINE, An.

(ME) DID THE POLICE SHOOT OR , THEY WERE FIGHT MELLIS?

(ms) No, He was shot by a fellow that that was a , against the strike, of coarse. Some of THEM were, some of THEM went to work regar Reguardless, THEY CROSSED THE PICKIT LINES, you know, but ah, my Husband was a real backer of the union. HT THAT TIME, (me) what mines were cuosed, what ones were they...?

(MS) AH, LETS SEE THEY CLOSED THE HOLMES MINE, AND THEY CLOSE
THEY ... AH... AND THE BARN, THE BARNEM MINE WAS CLOSED, AND THE
NEGAUNEE MINE WAS CLOSED AT THAT TIME, You mean because of
the Strike? Yes all the mines in here, around here were
closed at that time, because of the strike most of them
were closed.

(ME) WHAT MINES WERE AROUND HERE? WAS THERE THE TROOPS OR THE ONE IN TOWN?

(MS) OH THERE AH ... MA

(ME) CR THE ONE IN PALMER, THE EMPIRE?

(MS) You mean the Empire. No that wasn't THAT WASN'T AH,
OPEN AT THAT TIME, AND THE TILDEN WASN'T OPEN AT THAT TIME
EITHER. NOT THE WAY IT IS NOW. AN OPEN, It was, The TILDEN WAS,
THEY WA, THEY WERE MINING AT THE TILDEN, BUT NOT AS MUCH, AS
EXTENSIVELY AS they are now. AND THEN THERE WAS AH, THE
NEGALINEE MINE, AND THERE WAS THE MATHER B, and the MATHER
A, MINE, THEY were closed. AND...

(ME) WHICH ONE, I GOT those MAKED UP, WHERE WAS THE MATHER A, was that the one in Ishpeming?

IMS) WHICH

(ME) WHICH ONE WAS THAT ONE DOWN TOWN IN ISHPEMING, BY

(MS) THAT WAS THE BARNEM MINE, YOU MEAN that the shalfs

ONE Still there, You that was THE BARNEM MINE. OR

CLIFT SHALFT, THEY CALLED IT CLIFT SHAFT TOO.

(ME) WERE, I HEARD OF MATHER A and MATHER B, but I NEVER

REALLY KNEW WHERE THEY WERE.

(MS) WELL MATHER A, IS UM, OUT TOWARDS, YOU KNOW WABBASH HIGHTS

(ME) I Heard of it.

(MS) IT, THERE'S A LATE OUT THERE WHERE THEY CUT ICE, DID YOU KNOW WHERE THAT LAKE WAS, WELL, THAT WAS, THE MATHER A WAS OVER IN THAT LOCATION, AND THE MATHER B WAS MORE TOWARDS, MORE DOWN PAST THE GULF CORSE, BY NEGAUNCE. And then there was, the TRACY MINE WAS DOWN THERE TOO, AND THAT CLOSED. THAT BEEN CLOSED FOR QUITE SOME TIME, OF COARSE ALL THOSE MINES are closed now!

(ME) WHAT ABOUT REFRIDGERATORS? DID YOU have to buy ice?

(Ms) we had ice boxes, yes. Huh, Huh

(ME) DO YOU remember my GRAMPA? UM.

(MS) was "Head" Racine related to you?

(ME) He's my GREAT uncle, his father is that ice...

(ms) OCHHH.

(ME) He used to cut ice out on ...

(MS) Huh, Huh

(ME) I FORGOT WHAT LAKE.

(ms) Huh, Huh

(m) He used to deliver it.

(M5) Huh, Huh

(ME) Remember him? Racine?

(ms) I know your, I think your GRANDMA STILL LIVING, ISN'T SHE?

(ME) Yah

(MS) I KNOW YOUR GRANDMA THEN, TO SEE HER, YOU KNOW what I mean. I DON'T KNOW HER PERSONALL, BUT I KNOW WHO SHE IS.

(me) Do You REMEMBER Her Husband? when he used to sell ice?
(ms) Huh, Huh, I Bought Ice from him. Yeah, and "Head" Racine 10
used to come here, because he went with my daughter, when
she was young. She was only in High school when she went with Him.

(ME) I GETTING KIND OF NERVOUS ON THESE QUESTIONS. WHAT WAS, WHAT WAS, WHAT WERE WEDDINGS LIKE IN THOSE DAYS DID, THEY HAVE REAL BIG PARTIES?

(MS) YES THEY HAD PARTIES IN THOSE DAYS TOO ...

YME) JUST LIKE TODAX?

(MS) YOL , MOST OF THE WEDDING WERE IN THE HOMES, MY DAUGHTER WAS MARRIED, HERE IN THIS HOUSE AND A SHE BEEN NOW, ALMOST, ALMOST 30 years. SHE WAS MARRIED HERE AT HOME. OF COARSE, MY SONS WERE ALL MARRIED IN CHURCH, BUT SHE WAS MARRIED, SHE WHEN WANTED TO BE MARRIED HOME, SO SHE WAS MARRIED HOME. YES, WE HAD ALOT OF BIG WEDDINGS,

(ME) THE PRIEST CAME HERE?

(ME) THE PRIEST CAME HERE, OR DID, DID THEY HAVE THE PRIEST IN CHURCH

(MS) NO, SHE WAS MARRIED BY THE METHADISTS MINISTER, AND THE MINISTER CAME Here TO MARRY Here Her, in our home, yaahp.

- Get alet of toys like they Do TODAY? OR WAS IT, DURING THE DEPRESSION WAS IT HARDER TO BUY THEM?
- (MS) well, when the kips were small they were allowed to take the coarse, we used to send for everything, to MONTGOMERY WARDS, OR SEARS ROBCCK, OR SPEAGLES OR SOME PLACE WHERE THERE WAS A CATCLOG. AND THE KID WOULD BE ACCOMED TO, SIT DOWN AT THE TABLE, HND PICKOUT WHAT THEY WANTED FOR CHRISTMAS, THEM THEY WRITE THEIR LETTER TO SHNTA CLAUS, AND THEN THAT'S WHAT THEY GET FOR CHRISTMAS, WE NEVER, I VERY SELDOM GOT TO ISHPEMING FOR CHRISTMAS , very seldom until the KIDS were quite old.
- (ME) WAS THERE ANY STORFSLIKE Kmart? OR DID You Have to order,

(MS) THERE WAS NO THOPKO OF KMARTS OF . CA THERE WAS A WOOK-WERTHS STORE, THAT WAS BURNED, Here some years ago, THE WOOL WERTHS STORE, NOW ITS MERICKO'S, THEY REMODELED, (1) AND MADE MERICKOS CUT OF IT.

- ie) How important was education in those days?
- (MS) PARDON?
- (ME) HOW important was education in those days? WAS IT REALLY IMPORTANT If they...
- (MS) Well, EDUCATION Has always been important.
- (ME) I mean, was a real big thing to get to college?
- (ms) Yes, it was hard. THEY Had to work in order to do it because when their folks didn't make good wages, big wages, they couldn't afford to send them of coarse. THEY Never got the grants like they do now either, you know. And ah, ... there wasn't any of my children that went to college, None of them wanted to go, coney was the one that really should have gone, but he didn't want to go, so, he didn't go.
- (ME) was, did many people want, OH yeah, LIKE TODAY EVERYONE WANTS TO GO, LIKE, WAS THERE ANYTHING THAT, Learn about, LIKE TODAY you have to learn about computers, and that was there..?
- (ms) I can't hear too good.
- (ME) Ah, I goofed that question up. Do you remember any re... Do
- (ms) No, I went to National Mine School. I was going to the National Mine school when the old SCHOOL BURNED. I was in the fifth grade. And I went ahhm, to school, through the last half of the eleventh grade, and I had past my first my semester in the eleventh grade when I quit school. I had a year and a half to go and I didn't finish.
- (ME) DO YOU Remember if there were any teacher's sallaries cut, or? Any teachers that went on strike?
- (ms) Not that I can remember 1 NO THE ONLY Teacher strike was the one they had just recently. THAT'S THE CNLY STRIKE THAT CAN ever remember that the teachers ever set went on strike.
- (ME) Do you Remember who the Principle was , or?
