

Kevin Kari's interview with  
John Healey

Intro: Kevin Kari interviewing John Healey on  
February 9, 1993 at the Ishpeming  
Police Department.

Me: When and where were you born?

John: I was born in Ishpeming Michigan, October 31, 1943,

Me: What were your parents names?

John: John and Margaret Healey

Me: What are the names of your brothers and sisters?

John: Patrick Healey, Mary Kari Shirley Bjorn Joseph Healey

Me: Are you married and to who, when, where?

John: Yes, To Jeanne Berlucci August 7, 1976 in Ishpeming

me: What did your parents do for a living?

John: My father was a prison guard and my  
my mother worked at the bazzard  
and a housewife

me : Where did you go to school

John: Grade school I went to St. Johns  
and High school I went to Ishpeming  
High School.

me: Did you go to college

John: NO.

me: What special memories do you  
have of growing up in Ishpeming

John: I remember building ski hills and doing a lot  
of ski jumping when ~~you~~ I was young

Kevin: What special features do you remember  
about the Ishpeming and Negaunee Area when  
you were younger?

John: They were always friendly communities?

Kevin: Have they changed in any ways

John: Yes they have.

Kevin: How.

John: There seems to be a lot more crime.  
Criminal conduct.

Kevin: Anything else?

John: The drug scene is worse now <sup>the UP</sup> than  
it has ever been.

Kevin: What did you and your friends  
do for entertainment when you were young.

John: Very Seldom did we <sup>ever</sup> come to town, I can

Remember my Parents giving me \$0<sup>t</sup> on  
a Friday night and I would go to  
the American to have a hamburger,  
fries and a malt and head for  
home. Most of the time, at  
home, I was in bed before  
dark (laughing) We used to do  
a lot of ~~ski jumping~~ ski riding.  
We built our own hills.

We also went up to the bluff  
and used to sled down it.

In the summer, we would do  
a lot of fishing, swimming and  
camping

Kevin: Where did you and your friends go when you went to town

John: We never went to town

Kevin: Do you have any humorous stories about Ishpeming + Negaunee?

John: I can't think of any off hand.

Kevin: How old were you when you found your first job

John: About 13,

Kevin: What was it.

John: I worked in a gas station.

Kevin: What duties did you perform there

John: I worked at the St. Clair Station  
It used to be in town here

John: I used to get 10¢ per hour and I  
shoveled snow, cut wood and haul  
it into the station for winter.  
My next job I worked at  
Benzie's Highway Standard I  
had a big raise making 60¢  
per hour and I even bought  
A car

Kevin: Did you do the same duties.

John: I pumped gas, changed oil, grease  
jobs,

Kevin: What stands out the most  
About your first job

John: When they had a big tire  
Sale, open 24 hours

John: At the Highway Standard, there was  
a big tire sale and it was open  
24 hrs and I had to work  
All night.

Kevin: Were you ever in the military?

John: Yes

Kevin: What was your experience there?

John: I was in the Navy. I went through  
Boot camp at Great Lakes. After  
I got out of boot camp I went  
to the Naval Air test center  
at Patosic River, Maryland I spent  
A year there. Then I went  
Aboard the U.S.S. Intrepid,  
A Aircraft carrier. <sup>The</sup> Thing  
that stands out in my mind  
there is when I saw

John: was the first jet I ever ~~saw~~ seen  
to take off from a carrier that  
didn't ~~take~~ make it ~~off~~ and  
the pilot ejected and a helicopter  
picked him up and there wasn't a  
scratch on him

Kevin: Were you in anyways?

John: No, I was in Cuban Crisis in the  
60's

Kevin: How many years have you worked.

John: I started working when I was 13 and  
I'm 49 and still working

Kevin: Where were you employed the  
longest.

John: Right here at the I shippering  
Police Department.

Kevin: How or why did you choose your career

John: I always wanted to be a police officer when I was growing up. That was my big deal to be a police man I was working for CCJ in 1970 ~~when~~ and I saw a add in the newspaper where the city of Ishpeming was looking for a police officer so I applied for it and got the job. I've been here ever since.

Kevin: Describe the main Duties of your Job?

John: The main Duties of my job is running the police department budgets, staying within the budgets, making sure the officers are trained

John: Just trying to stay on top of  
old everything in the city and make  
it a safe place for citizens  
to live

Kevin: What kind of training is required for  
this job.

~~John~~: When I first of 1971 January 1, They  
required a basic Police Accademy  
440 hrs, that went into effect

Jan 1971, I started in March  
1971. Then I went to the  
police Accademy At Northern  
in the summer for 440 hrs, I  
graduated from there and that's  
the training I had During  
my time, I went to a  
Drug investigation school  
put on by the FBI in  
Escanaba back in 1974

John: In 75' I went to an advanced regular training I think in 76 or 77' I went for a month of Advanced training school down in Bay City, Michigan at Delft College

Kevin: Do they have the same training for the new officers?

John: Yes

Kevin: Is there any special equipment or clothing for your job.

John: During the winter they wear warm clothes, Bullet proof vests or body armor, they do carry weapons

Kevin: Does this job have any special rules or regulations to follow

John: lots of them; we have to obey all laws very careful even when not working to obey laws otherwise we stand out in peoples eyes and we have our rules and procedures here when we work everything we do has a rule that we have to follow

Kevin: What is the most rewarding part of your job

John: Catching bad people especially if they are harassing older people and doing stuff like that

Kevin: What is the most challenging part of your job

John: The most challenging part of my job is trying to cope with drugs in the area

Kevin: How have the duties of your job changed over the years?

John: When I first started at the police department for training we used to go out on a lot of foot patrol mostly on foot. Now it is mechanical done in police cars. Your hands are tied on what you can do

Kevin: Did any other family members choose the same career

John: No.

Kevin  
Did your job put you in many 14  
Dangerous positions.

John: Many, One time we had a call with a man with a gun in a bar we had to diffuse the situation by taking away the loaded shotgun one time I was on a chase that turned out to be OK. I've probably had 4 or 5 incidents that involved guns

Kevin: Please describe what your co workers are like

John: I work with ~~the~~ patrman most of the people who I work with are good people I don't have any problems with any of them

John: I work now lots with the  
ctd Sheriff the police Chief of  
Marquette, and Negauze. We  
have monthly meetings to  
discuss what we are going  
to do. I work with the  
City Manager and council.  
I don't have any problems  
with them at the present

Kevin: Could you describe some  
humorous events in your career

John: One of the humorous things I  
had was when I was a  
young patrol man, I was with  
an older patrolman we were  
checking buildings out and  
he was trying to show me  
the right way to do. At  
that time when you found  
an open door you would always  
draw your revolver

John: for your own safety, I was walking behind the older officer, I was just learning the ropes and all of sudden I heard "what are you doing in there" and there was a guy who had broken into this business sitting on the toilet. Another time the same guy was on his feet and I was in a car he was whispering on to the radio to meet me at Hickey's Bar because someone broke into a garage over there I went and parked the car on the other side of the street and be very quiet and I walked in the door and I kicked the door it hit him in the face broke his nose

Kevin At Anytime did you feel like changing your career

John: NO

Kevin: Why

John: I always have something new to  
Do each day

Kevin: What are your biggest responsibility on  
your job.

John: Making Sure police officers  
Are trained, I have a full crew  
on. Making the streets safe  
trying to clear up the  
Drugs

Kevin: Have you received any special  
Awards

John: I was patrol man of the year  
once Back in the 70's about  
77 or 78

Kevin: What are your favorite hobbies  
of yours free time

John: I like Fishing's

Kevin: Do you have any special stories  
about Fishing.

John: I was fishing out on Seug lake  
one time we were in a rickidy  
boat I was with my cousin  
he had brought a boat from down  
state we took it out on the  
lake we rode it across Seug  
lake and we were fishing for  
45 minutes and I told him  
that my feet are getting wet  
so it was dark and I got  
a flash light and looked at  
the bottom of the boat and  
he said to start bailing  
I bailed water for about 15  
minutes and water kept comming  
up I said we better get out of  
here so we started going back

John: When we got back to shore, I  
ctd looked and I saw a hole that  
There was a hole that I could  
stick my finger through  
Another time we were out there  
in a different boat a storm came  
up we just had oars we were  
out there in rain, thunder, lightning  
and hail we tried to get the 2  
boats 2 people in one and 3 in  
the other the wind was bad  
and every thing got bad as  
we tried to turn the boat  
around to get ashore and  
we broke an oar so we  
had to go across the lake  
with 1 oar so it was a  
fun ride

Kevin: Have you been involved  
with any clubs or  
organizations

Johni Not lately

Kevin : Overall what is your fondest  
memory of your working days?

Johni : It was probably in the year  
1975 when I made 100 arrests  
with possession of marijuana.

Kevin : What year did you become Chief  
of Police.

Johni : 1983

Kevin : Are you a member of a Union

Johni : NO

Kevin : ~~What~~ If you could do it over again  
would you choose the same career.

Johni : Yes because I like the challenge  
something new every day I had  
~~3~~ 3 jobs in my career the Navy, Hercules  
Power Company for a couple months then  
I went to CCI to here. I really like this work

Kevin: What did you do At Hercules Power 21

John: I was a labour I loaded and unloaded  
Semi's

Kevin: Did you like it

John: No

Kevin: Do you have any other stories about  
your job

John: I can remember when me and another  
patrolman were on midnight shift

There was a car on the wrong  
side of the street ahead of us  
on 1<sup>st</sup> street he turned in  
front of us so we turned the red  
lights on to stop him he didn't  
want to stop so we went from 1<sup>st</sup>  
to empire, empire to 41 and he started  
to go west on 41 we were behind  
him with lights and siren on  
trying to get him to pull over  
but he wouldn't

John he was throwing beer bottles out 22  
the window trying to give us a flat  
tire so back in those days, when  
you went past the 41 club you  
were without radio contact no -  
one knew where we were we  
chased this clown all the  
way to Michigamni trying  
to chase him up and down  
Main street with our lights  
and siren on finally some  
citizen came out of his house  
and we finally got him stopped  
and my partner was banging on  
the window with his gun trying  
to get into his car, and he thought  
we were shooting at him so he  
jumped out of his car with his  
hands up but we weren't really  
shooting at him that's one of  
the humorous story that I  
can think of

Kevin: Have you worked for the Ishpeming Police Department all your life.

John: Yes, since March 5, 1971

~~Kevin~~: Do you have to do a lot of paper work

John: Yes lots

Kevin: Do you have to do a lot of research.

John: Yes, I have had a detective on for about a year. He does a lot of research he does a good job. It gives me a lot more time I'm in the process now getting a computer people laugh because not to long ago I was asking for electric typewriters. We also need a fax machine for search warrants rather than running to Marquette

Kevin: Do you go to a lot of conventions

John: There are a lot of chiefs meetings

but I can't get to many because

I don't have much time, and save

the city Money,

Kevin: How many officers are on duty?

John: Now I have 3 on, after 11 I'll

have 2 on and vice versa

Days there are 3 people on and

9 day officer at Phelps

Kevin: Do you wish you had more officers

John: I sure do when I started there

were 18 patrolman 4 sergeants 1 detective

9 day warden 2 meter maid's and

2 dispatchers now I have 9 patrolman

1 sergeant, 1 detective and myself and  
9 dispatcher

John: In 1992 there 384 Arrests In 1993

so far we made 33 arrests 1992  
There were 207 arrests

John In 1985 there was a murder  
in January of 85 and in  
the Summer of 86 there  
is a lot of suicide around  
here; It goes in spurts It  
seems that you get a rash of  
it then it slows down  
Kevin: Do you have any stories about  
your job.

John: I remember at the Ski Tournaments  
wetter I wanted to or not  
they dropped you off and you  
wouldn't have a car to sit in  
on foot patrol seeing kids drinking  
and traffic control now they  
sit in the car

Kevin: Were you involved in any clubs.

John: When we were young we  
would have Ski jumps  
we built furnace in Sulzberg  
Slaughter in West Ishpeming and  
another in Junction

John: By mooses on the bluff. At the  
winter sports there were 2 jumps

Kevin: Did you have a lot of fun?

John: we had a good time we'd  
go around after Christmas  
and collect all the trees for  
a landing and bump

Kevin: What did you do in the summer?

John: fishing play football and baseball  
go upon the bluff, make  
forts

Kevin: Is there anything else you  
would like to share about  
the area?

John: I guess that has changed the  
people complain that there is  
not anything for the kids to  
do But I think there is  
a lot for them to do they just

John : that they don't do it, I remember  
when I started the hangout was the  
congress we had to have 3 or  
4 officers there. But most  
of the kids are absent

Kevin : Is there anything else you would  
like to add.

John : no If I do I'll call you

Kevin : Thank you for sharing your  
thoughts with me

John : OK
