C - yes

me - did anything happen drastically in your
family - death, or anything like that or a

C - in my family:

me - yes

C - Well my husband died

me - how many brothers + sisters did you have

C - 5 brothers and 8 of us girls.

me - going back to your school years what was
high school like

C - I never had a chance to go to high school
I had to quite school and stay home to take care
of my mother cause she was ill.

me - what grade did you quite school in?

c - well, I was going into 9th grade.

ya. I had just passed into the 9th grade.

me - so you missed high school:

c - yes.

me - do you think there is a big difference
in modern day schools and the schools you
went to?

c - Oh! definitely, definitely

me - how did you meet your late husband?
Seeing that you didn't meet him in high school,

c - he lived not far from me, you mean
grandpa. [REDACTED]

me - yes

c - yes, he lived not too far from my house

me - and he also lived in Tipton all his life?

c - yes he did.

me - when did you marry him?

c - Dec. 3 - 1942.

me - after you were out of school and old enough to go out on your own, what did you do with yourself?

C - I was home, and I was married at 17

me - when did you really start to get into making foods.

C - when I was little, I used to help my mom

me - did you get a job at making foods?

C - not until my husband passed away.

me - where was it at?

C - Toknys

me - when you make your pastys what do you put in them that make them so good?

C - Well just your meat, potatoes & onions

me - Oh so its not no different recipe its just - grandmas good cooking.

C - laughing - yes I guess so!

me - what was your favorite food to make?

C - I like making everything & everything. I don't know about anything to be my favorite.

me - Today do you like to stick with

you using modern methods?

C - yes I stick with old bakery methods
I just start things from scratch.

- me - So you will always stick to the way you use to cook when you were younger and now?
- c - Yes I will, cause I like that a lot better the mixes you get today
- me - what utensils do you use, is there a big difference in them, I mean in the modern day utensils?
- c - no not really just your basic utensils.
- me - if you could do it all over again from when you were out of school what would you do.
- c - NO I wouldn't I do it the same as I did, I guess?
- me - How impressed with yourself when you started cooking, did you think ~~that~~ that you were good or just like a normal cooker?
- c - Well I don't know if I thought I was good, but I certainly tried my best to be good
- me - If you thought that anything could be better what would it be? I mean like if you could of worked somewhere else or did something else?
- c - No cause I really liked my job

me - who were you working for again?

C - I worked for Johnny Young, Johnysdown town, for the Venice Super Club & for the Matherin.

me - which one of ~~the~~ those jobs was more suitable for you do you think?

C - they were all good to me but I think Johnys because he had done some work with me, and I had worked for Gordons town house in Negannet

me - And that's how you met my present gramps?

C - NO, I met him when I was hanging around with the girls, after my husband died of course.

me - how many years ago?

C - I think 13 ya in 74

me - and yes made you happy:

me - laughing

c - laughing with my grandpa in the back,

(cuckling), do I have to answer that?

Sometime he has (laughing)

me - oh ya!

c - hes a pretty good egg!

me - going back to your younger years

when you were taking care of your
mother what was she like, her national-
ity?

c - She was Italian and she came down
from Italy years ago.

me - did she ever explain her journey
to you or talk about it.

c - No, all she told me is when she came
over on the boat and that's all
I remember but she was a young
girl when she came.

me - how was your life back then?
how did you entertain yourself

c - Read, work, we never had much

entertainment in those days, we just P8
Read & Played hide-n-seek.

c. with my brothers and sisters that's as far as the entertainment went then we went along to go and do things like you ~~—~~ kids do me - like galavant (chatting)

C - yes, we weren't allowed to go swimming we weren't allowed to put a bath tub in our house cause my dad was so strict, and they passed away in 1960 my mom and 1969 my dad.

me - did you like go on vacation or go anywhere?

C - no we weren't allowed to go anywhere, we just did the same thing day after day.

me - the same thing now a big change?

C - well after I would baby sit when I was home and after that I babysat for nothing, good thing I always loved kids

me - back then how far did money go like for example a pound of flour back then to now?

C - Oh I don't remember really but everything was a lot cheaper.

my grandpa in the back - I know it was
10¢ a pound for butter.

C - yes, everything was a lot cheaper
than, but of course you never
got paid as much back then
either as you do now

me - after you had a life of your
own did you enjoy and go on
vacations?

C - no not really but the 1 vacation
I went on was to Illinois
where I went to see my family
cause I have 2 sisters and 2
brothers there,

me - now these days do you like
to go on vacations? have
you done that recently?

C - well sure, but I haven't done
it recently, we haven't gone
anywhere here we Gordon!

grandpa - well we went to Rochester

C - well that was more of a journey
then a vacation! (LAUGH.)

me - what was that like

C - well, it was a nice town

me - how many kids did you have

c - 2. a son and a daughter
That was enough!

me - were they good kids or brats

c - no they were good & well behaved
children!

me - well what did they do for fun?

c - anything & everything they always had
fun. you name it they did.

me - anything ever happen to them?

c - well, my daughter had Pneumonia when
she was $3\frac{1}{2}$ and was in the hospital
my son broke his leg striking
upon a hill behind our house, right
over there. I don't think anything
else happened.

me - were they good in school?

c - yes but they could of been better
but they were afraid of pure pressure
they didn't want to be to good
an account of the other kids which
was a mistake cause if robots could

me - when you went out did you like to go out as a family?

c - Oh sure, we always took the kids when we went out, always we use to take them riding when my husband would get off of work, stop out out, go bowling.

me - were your kids fussy eaters?

c - my son was kind of a fussy eater, but my daughter was pretty good she ate for a while though.

me - did you always have enough?

c - Always, There was always enough food that everyone could just come in and sit down & eat

me - did you eat good when you were small?

c - yes but we had 13 kids we didn't have a variety like you do now.

me - how many brothers & sisters are still alive?

c - well, 8 I think

me - going back to you children when they were young did they get the church to watch TV.

c - well when the TVs came out yes we got one.

me - how old were they, did they like to watch TV on Saturday mornings?

c - oh yes they loved that, but I can't remember what year they came out but my daughter used to like to watch Garry Pitkiss, so her & uncle would sit up & watch them & she would stand up on the rocker & scream (laughing) & uncle would laugh at her.

me - was my mom & my uncle always fighting at each other or were they good to each other?

c - no, but she used to tease him.

me - how many years were they apart?

c - 4

me - when you were living with your parents what kind of transportation did you have?

c - we had to walk to school & we had no vehicle my dad would walk to the store when he needed something.

me - when you were young what were the holidays like? X-mas did you ever go trick-or-treating or anything like that?

C - I can't remember if we went Trick-or-treating we must have but X-mas wasn't like you kids have now we new there was no Santa Claus cause we couldn't afford a lot cause there was so many in the family to get all kinds of things like you kids get ~~now~~ now.

me - was it a present per child?

C - That's about it

me - what was it, toys, clothes?

C - As toys it was always clutter or something to wear.

me - how was X-mas when your two children were young?

C - I say had a very good X-mas they always got plenty of things well they got almost everything they asked for.

me - what was your favorite holiday when your children were young

C - X-mas cause I always enjoyed watching the kids seeing how excited they were when they got up.

C - that to me was the greatest happiness
to see my 2 children smiling with joy
cause they got what they wanted.

C - I don't remember, I would of had to been
back in 72 cause grandpa bought it & and they
loved it.

ME - This house is it the same one you lived
in all your life?

C - Yes grandpa built it this has suppose to
of being a garage, the living room & the dining

ME - anything added on to it?

C - yes the living room & dining room
and my husband had got done with the
house he landed in the hospital and
soon after he died.
