Me. Did you have lots of chores when you were growing up?

Grand. ya, I had to get the cows, then I had to start milking the cows, that's after the farm was gone, we only had a couple cows. We had to get the wood in, I had to split the wood, kept us ~~busy~~ busy, kept us out of trouble, feed the chickens.

Grand. One time I, mom feed the chickens when I was working for the state and Ma was feeding the chickens, and one chicken attacked her, scratched, and bit her. Dad came home from work, and ma well, I'm not feeding the chickens any more, because that chicken attacked her, so I went and feed the chicken the next day and he attacked me. Pa came home, I told him look it, if you want to keep that chicken you got to feed the chickens because I will have to kill him, he said you are just like your mother, I will feed the chickens, It went on for two weeks, One sunday we had the toughest little chicken you ever seen, he was tough, Pa had to kill him. 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Grand. Back in 1938, I was a young kid and we got trapped in the farm 9 days because of a big snow storm, we couldn't get out for 9 days, a guy came out with a big tractor with a big V-plow on it and plowed a road for us.

Grand. We started at eight, and got out at four.

Me. Were you teachers very strict?

Grand. Some were, I had some really good teachers, and some bad teachers. I didn't mind a strict teacher as long as they are fair. Some teachers could not keep your attention so you wanted to fall asleep.

Grand. No not really, sometimes you would get in a scrap.

Me. What was the funniest thing you ever did?

Grand. One time we were out radin apples
We were up in a apple tree and this
Old guy, that we know couldn't catch
us and we knew it, and he come out
and say get out of them trees you
kids. I ~~told~~ told you to get out
of those trees, and what we didn't
know that his son was home from
the service, and he ran after us and
caught us. He gave us a good wack on.
me. Did you ever go on any adventures
without telling your parents?

Grand. Only once I was about 3 or 4 years old
and I ran away from home and my
Caught me across the field, and come
up to me and she had a stick. Every
time she caught up to me she gave me
a wack on the bat. I never ran away
from home again because I was scared to.

Me. Who was your favorite person when you were growing up?

Grand. I think petro in the service was pretty important to took up to. Many, a lot of ski jumpers, like Clay Hill.

Me. How long did you ski jump?

Grand. I ski jumped till I graduated. Last time I jumped I ended up in the hospital, and I decided that was it.
