dad: my current job is A loader operator in the pit production, And I guess the main duties of it is cleaning up the roads and cleaning the production trucks loaders and dozers can use the roads it is had to explain most of it is moving chunks and debris so the vehicles can use the roads

dad: most of the training is on the job training  
and there was some schooling they would have you  
attend safety school training on how to use the equipment

dad: The most I like I guess, the meeting of the  
men that are one you crew and getting to know  
everybody, and learning how to run the equipment  
is enjoyable too, over the years they really improved  
their equipment so you are using ~~modern~~ technology you  
can with your job.

Dad: [Everyday you are in dangerous situation. You just have to make sure you are using your head and thinking about the ~~different~~<sup>different</sup> aspects of your job] <sup>good quick</sup>  
I guess the most dangerous would be. A few years ago I was a dozer operator a tractor operator and that you get into some dangerous situations making roads and dozing on top of ~~ore~~<sup>ore</sup> piles. you really got to use your head and you got to use the talker that you have accumulated over the years of running this equipment include

M: Have you been involved or have you ever witness any accidents, if so please describe

Dad: I myself been involved in a accident and I have witnessed some also. The one that I was involved in was when I was operating a dozer we were on a waste dump and there was a truck <sup>120</sup> ton production truck coming into dump a load of waste in the mean

time A fuel truck came to give the tractor fuel so I got out of my dozer and the fuel man proceeded to fuel the dozer and I got out of my dozer and was going motion the truck where to dump the load part of the procedure was to the truck would not be able to dump it by it self he would need somebody show where to dump and as the truck was backing up the tire exploded it had a blow out and the tires on this equipment is so big that the force of the blow out blew all the rock that was under right tire up in my direction knocking my ~~saftey~~ hard hat off breaking my saftey <sup>glasses?</sup> and throwing rock up my front of my legs and my front chest I wasn't seriously hurt I could of been bad but the mine did send me to the hospital for x-rays and broken bones ,and the most the thing that did happen to me was rock was inbedded in front legs And that just work it's way out after a while. And their was another accident ; was involved in a quite A few years ago I happend to be on a shovel that is an electrical shovel which loads the 120 ton production trucks (5) And AS I was digging into

A bank with the bank must be 90-100 feet  
I was digging into the bank and a chunk came  
right down into the cab of the shovel the rock  
hit the glass and broke the glass I had glass up  
and down my arms and into my lap the rock did  
not hit me myself but ~~the~~ the only injury I  
had is from the glass going into my arms, it  
wasn't as bad as it looked once we got  
the glass out of the arm there was no scars  
so we did not have to go to the <sup>hospital</sup> hospital  
but it was a dangerous situation also, And  
I have witnessed an accident I seen people who where  
truck drivers driving the big trucks backing up and dumping  
their loads on top of a dump and the dump would  
what we would ~~saw~~ say Let go that means it will settle  
down and the trucks would settle down with them  
I did not witness the accident that had happened but  
we did see a truck that was ~~a~~ half way down the  
dump if it fell down the dump and the man did  
die because he jumped out of the truck it  
is something you have to be thinking of all of the  
time. Make sure you emphasize the  
danger of his job & all drivers

dad: Well there is lots of situations that occur when  
you have been working with a crew in our crew of  
men their is probably 60 men on our crews so it's  
hard to pick out an humorous situations their is probably

I thought of the older men were were all young  
19 years old or 20 I just seemed Humorous to  
see some of the older men that I thought were old  
they were in their 50 and their 60s some of the  
fooling around just a their ways where humorous

dad: the working conditions in the ~~Pitt~~<sup>Pit</sup> are changing  
~~constantly~~ constantly in the winter you have slippery roads the snow  
wet conditions in the summer time you have dust  
heat rain, so it is a mixture of weather that we are

dad: The safety standards I don't think have changed the safety policies have changed C.C.I has really ~~had~~<sup>has</sup> good safety policies they have more schooling in the past 10 years I would say and more school of safety and the improvements are just the company does constantly make improvements they are include

dad: The duties of my job they haven't changed the size of the equipment has changed and the way you do it might change but the duties has basically been the same over the years include + quote

I said before there is 60 men on the crew and usually you are staying with these guys for some guys you get to know for 20 years you have been working with these guys and women their is some group they care about you and they care safety about you most of the guys want to see you make sure you do your job right include

dad: Yes lots of times I have lots of times after performing the same job you just get ended up getting <sup>bored</sup> and you really have to use you mind to give yourself a little <sup>incentive</sup> ~~insatiate~~ to do a good job any more and A lot of times the iron Industry has troubles layoffs ~~strike~~ strikes any time you have a layoff or a strike that's what makes you think you should have been ceerer? career!
