Q. Um, do you know how the fire started?

A. that I don't know, nobody knew exactly how it started, probly in the boiler room some where

O. Who rebuilt it?

A. The new school youmean?, ya, It was called the foster construction company

a. About now long did it take them to rebuild

A. Oh! It took them about a years.

a where did you go to school in the meantime? DI went to school in the old town hall 6th 1th t 815 some had classes in the Norweigen school oh dwand there was all succles bekelswhat som in the old swedish church and amine company office and there was classes in what they call the old red school house and a the

Finnish church and methodist

a. was the new school any better?
