Unde Harold: Yeah, for ... 4 years, Has National Mine won the U. P. Championship in '29.

Unde Harold: They went down state. Then the following year I was playing, we lost out to the same team National Mine played. That was Rock and National Mine beat them and we played practically the same team and we almost beat them. That was the last year anyone went to Lower Michigan
