Inter: Well I didn't go to kindergarten here, we could get a ride in the morning but we couldn't get on the bus, and our parents, some were either too poor or just wouldn't do it, and my parents just wouldn't do it, so I went right into first grade, well it must of been 950 but anyway I graduated in 1962

Inter: I remember all of them, there's Mrs. Magnusson Mrs. Warrigan Mrs. Wineberg (I forgot a couple how about that) Mrs. Johnson, Mrs. Bandier, that just about takes care of grade school, and I was a good kid in grade school, I didn't get into, well when I was in sixth grade I was in safety patrol, you guys don't have that

There was an early bus and the sixth grade kids were the big kids and we had to go out and patrol the buses make sure the kids got from the bus to the school and then 1 patrol person would ride the bus around National Mine

Inter: Ah, yeah, see Mrs. Oja, math teacher, he was also a class adviser, we made him, I made him a B-Day cake I took it out of the oven at home and it fell. He used to call me Miliimol instead of Miliimaki, I said I wouldn't answer him so then he started calling me foy Um I had Mrs. Rain for home, Ec and English, didn't do well in those. either, we had to embroider address on scarves and I had to scrub the middle part off, the blue marks cause I didn't finish it in time she excuse me from English class to go in there and scrub those off so they would be done for parents night or whatever that was called

Me: What was your favorite subject

Inter: I didn't like school, I don't think I had one, I just endured them, cause I had to do it so I did it.

Me: What was your most difficult subject

Inter: I avoided math like the plague but I did get through math and geometry, but I can't do algebra with it now

Me: What kind of extra-curricular activities were offered

Inter: Not much, we had band and cheer leading which was the select group that's not that, we had the echo which was the school paper, my girl friend was the editor and I was the typist. Um that was about it, there was baseball for the boys and that's it

Me: Which ones were you involved in

Inter: Everything but the boys baseball, I tried to get in there to but they wouldn't let me (haha)

me: Do you remember any special moments about it  
Anita: cheerleading, when we were cheerleaders we used to do  
a certain yell,

Anita: we traveled by bus and the boys had 1 bus and the  
girls had another bus and we went to Brewster, Chassel,
