See: Every time I start a letter I wonder if you have been receiving all the ones I write.

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We had a very rough crossing of North Sea from Harwich, England, to Esbjerg, Denmark? (22 hours) Nice first evening and night but woke up next A.M. and could hardly get dressed what with being banged about! One other passenger in our room--she was sick all night. Up on deck everyone green and quiet! I and three Danish fellows only ones at table when I went in for breakfast -- was another man there at first but he left the table rapidly with his hand over his mouth when we started to eat. My coffee spilled all over my bread and jam. Raining and people sick on deck so I went up in far bow and R joined me -- looking awful. An English chap came up and we talked and both laughed when R - made a dive for the rail. Then soon he made for the rail too -- first putting his head under his cycling rain cape and removing his teeth -- so B -- says -- (all) English people have complete sets of false teeth -- don't go to dentists at all till ready to have 'em) Well, the ship was in the trough of waves, wind blowing 67 miles an hour and a gale is 80, and from the bow it looked as though we were going over any

minute (we kept saying good-by to each other.) and the stern would disappear completely! Even I felt a bit of motion in my stomach sometime--but I didn't have to contribute to the support of the fishes as practically everyone else did! If it hadn't been for the rain and cold wind I would have loved it. Stayed in the bow from 9;30 A.M. till 2:00 P.M. (Couldn't eat lunch as China would break when they put it on table--I got an apple from the stewardess) Three Americans we met in London were them and we had fun first evening.

Danish passenger cycled us to hostel in Embjerg -- is a technical school, and while closed in summer, the hostlers can use it -- classrooms have highly polished floors and there are mattresses which we put on the floor to sleep on. Sleep well too! And wash basins on the benches for bashs. The next night in Grindsted was the same kind. In Esbjergthere was a marvelous health exhibit in the school from Germany, glass man, etc. Warden who had lived in Washington got a doctor who knew a little English to take us through -- we expected a bearded old man, but Dr. was young, tall, blonde, very handsome, and threw in a few points of his own that kept us in stitches. Third night in Silkeborg -the hostel was full -- a very lovely model one set in beautiful garden and on the banks of lovely river -- no one spoke English, till finally hostlers (Mr. and Mrs. Insulmann and son, Leif (Life) who had lived in Chicago, came over had helped us. Took us to K.F.U.K. (combined Y.W. and Y.M.) where we got cheap and very good lodging. Denmark is very inexpensive -- in Great Britain it costs a shilling each to stay over night and here it costs 1 kroner (20) cents for both of very death breakfer s exilling or 1/3 (306)
