Commission Receives Copies Of Report On Area Planning Study

City commissioners received copies of the first report made as part of the "701 study" at a regular meeting of the commission this week.

The "701 study" is being conducted by Vilcan-Leman and Associates, Inc., Southfield, under contract with the city, Chocolay and Marquette Townships and the Marquette Board of Education.

The "701 study" is derived from Section 701 of the Area Redevelopment Act (which enables the federal government to participate in local projects on a 50-50 basis, or, as in the case of Marquette, on a 75-25 basis, if the area in question has been designated as a depressed area.)

A preliminary report in a study

being made for the Marquette Public Schools and the part of the general development plan covering population, land use, physical features, planning units, recreation and community facilities have been completed.

The city commission will hold a special meeting next Thursday with the Marquette Area Planning Commission, city officials, and the two township boards to review the first phase of the "701 Study."

Also at the meeting, commissioners referred to City Manager Thomas Moore and the Marquette Planning Commission a request submitted by Harlan J. Larson, chamber of commerce president, for the installation of mercury vapor lights on W. Washington St. from Fourth St. to the intersection of the new bypass on U.S. 41 west.

"Increase Valuations"
The chamber request, which included a petition, stated, "Well-lighted streets will not only increase business but will most certainly increase valuations of all adjacent property."

Larson's letter urged the inclusion of mercury vapor lights, the same as were installed on W. Washington St. from Front to Fourth Sts., in the budget for 1963-1964.

The commission also:
• Granted permission to the Ahmed Temple of Marquette to present a Shrine Circus on the afternoons and evenings of May 8 and 9 at the Northern Michigan College fieldhouse. Because proceeds of the event will be used for charity, the usual fee was waived.

• Approved a request made by Dr. Harold E. Wright, head of the NMC music department, for permission to use the light and power department's streamer to advertise the college's production of "Guys and Dolls" March 12-14. The streamer will be erected across Front St., near the intersection with Bluff St.

• Ordered placed on file a notice of a conference of health officers with public officials, which will be sponsored by the Michigan Association of Health Officers and the University of Michigan's school of public health, March 27-29 in Ann Arbor.

• Heard Mayor James R. Smith congratulate Marquette's Bantam Mobils in winning the Upper Peninsula Junior Hockey Championship this weekend at Houghton.

School Accounting Program Again Offered At Tech

HOUGHTON — This year, for the third consecutive summer, Michigan Tech will offer a three-week summer graduate program in public school fund accounting, scheduled to open Aug. 5.

Sam B. Tidwell, CPA and professor of accounting at Tech, will direct the program. Cooperating agencies are the Michigan Department of Public Instruction, Michigan Association of School Administrators, Michigan Association of School Boards, Michigan School Business Officials Association and Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants.

The program, which may be taken on a non-credit basis or for six quarter hours of credit (four semester hours), is designed for any individual involved with public school accounting. This includes school business officials, school board members, college teachers of accounting or educational administration, accounting practitioners who audit school funds and students of educational administration.

Special lecturers will include Leslie W. Richards of Negaunee, president of the Michigan Association of School Boards.

Lent Menus Dominate At Food Stores

DETROIT (AP) — Protein is offered in a host of attractive forms — both meat and Lenten non-meat — at the nation's food stores this weekend.

Beef and pork prices continue low or lower, with heavy late winter livestock marketing. There also are several poultry attractions.

Eggs Drop
Eggs took a drop in most markets, fresh and canned seafood items are plentiful and cottage cheese, other cheeses and dairy products in general are economy-priced.

Among beef offerings, roasts are strongly featured. A sampling of some price tags at a national chain includes rib roasts at 69 cents a pound, round roasts 85 and rump roasts 89.

Poultry Features
Both cured and fresh pork items are economically priced. Poultry features include turkey, in the Midwest especially; chicken fryers, particularly in the Southeast, and roasting chickens.

Fresh vegetable offerings include cabbage, radishes, tomatoes, celery, onions and potatoes. Iceberg lettuce has come down in price at the same time quality has risen.

Fruit buys continue to be bananas, apples, pears and canned cherries. Also, citrus prices are slipping downward, with oranges, lemons and grapefruit becoming more attractive.

Bay De Noc Base Keeps F-101's In Sky

GLADSTONE — On guard up in the cold blue Upper Peninsula winter sky the pilot of a F-101-B Voodoo jet interceptor pours on the coal, shoots straight up faster than a bullet — burns 2,000 gallons of jet fuel a minute.

That's more fuel in a minute than you burn in the family jolopy in two years of average driving. Jet Fuel Stream In that same sky every minute of the day and night are the snarling ever flying B-52 Hustler bombers, each carrying 46,666 gallons of fuel, burning 3,000 gallons of it every hour.

The secret of keeping our defense fleet floating aloft on JP-4 jet fuel is the Holly Corp. terminal here, operated by the Wade Corp. of Dallas, Texas. Looking much like the near-by Standard Oil and Mobil Oil terminals on the shore of Little Bay de Noc, it is the fountain of a jet fuel stream.

Next Shipment In March Stored here are 640,000 barrels of fuel — 26,880,000 gallons in eight tanks. Bringing the fuel in from Whiting, Ind., and East Chicago in 1962 were 34 tankers. The last arrival, on Dec. 29, followed a Coast Guard icebreaker in and out. The next shipment is due in March.

But if the Air Force wanted a tanker in now, it could follow an icebreaker in," said Monroe F. Bouchet, 37, a retired army engineer major, is in command of the terminal and its 10 employees. He built this same type of installation for the Army in Korea, Morocco, Italy, France and Libya.

No Trick For Bouchet Handling all this fuel is no trick for Bouchet, but the quality and quantity standards are high — almost impossible. One month, Bouchet poured 26 million gallons of fuel through the pipe line to K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base. He was shook when jangled by the government to explain a shortage that month — one gallon.

Temperature Problem Complicating the problem is the varying temperature of the fuel from 7 degrees in midwinter to 76 in summer. All incoming and outgoing fuel must be converted to 60 degrees to compute gallonage.

Water Dangers One drop of water could kill a Voodoo pilot. It freezes at high altitudes, clogging the fuel injection system. Bouchet meets every ship, takes a sample from each of its 14 to 18 fuel compartments. A chemist checks each sample for purity in the lab on the terminal. Each com-

New Carrier Introduced By Lake Shore

IRON MOUNTAIN — A new combination personnel and supply carrier has been introduced by Lake Shore. The 50-inch high unit has been designed and manufactured primarily for underground operations but can also be used in surface operations. It is diesel powered for underground or gasoline powered for surface operations.

Seats 10 Men Know as the Wagner PT-10, the carrier seats 10 men, including the driver, and hauls one full ton of supplies. Objectives Given Under the academy adoption program, each squadron is sponsored by a wing or group of an active Air Force unit. Since tactical units are desired, only ADC, AFSC, MATS, TAC and SAC participate.

Objectives of the program are to associate cadets with members of Combat and Support Commands, motivate and train them toward a professional career, and stimulate interest and appreciation in the academy throughout the Air Force.

Mild Here, But Below Zero Inland

It looks like March will come in like a very chilly lamb, with more cold temperatures expected for the next few days. Temperatures in Marquette yesterday and last night didn't get down to zero, but the Marquette County Airport in Negaunee Township reported a low of -17 and K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base had a low of -7 this morning.

High here yesterday was 23 about noon, and the low was 10 above, at 11 p. m. The overnight low was seven, at daybreak. Below Normal For Month Yesterday's average temperature was five degrees below normal. The average has been above normal only three times this month, on the 5th, 6th and 17, and is 7.9 below normal for the month.

In spite of light snow yesterday, the cloud cover was thin and the sun was out 70 per cent of the time from dawn to dusk. Two-tenths of an inch of snow fell. Heaviest snowfall was in the early afternoon, when visibility was reduced to a mile and a half to two miles. Snow depth this morning stood at 17 inches. Total snowfall this month is 12.2 inches, but the normal amount for the month is 18 inches. For the season, total snowfall is 60.9 inches and normal amount is 77 inches.

Other early morning temperatures were -5 at Houghton and at Sault Ste. Marie, -4 at Menominee and at Iron Mountain and -9 at Ironwood. Tonight is expected to be fair and cold, with lows from zero to five above near Lake Superior and 10 to 15 below inland. Increasing cloudiness and a little warmer temperatures are predicted for tomorrow, with occasional light snow likely by tomorrow night. Saturday's high temperature is expected to be in the low 20s, with variable cloudiness and scattered snow flurries.

British Want Bigger Share Of TV Profits

LONDON (AP)—The British government is planning to take a bigger cut of the huge profit Britain's commercial television network is piling up. Postmaster General Reginald Bevins told the House of Commons Monday night he wants 18 million pounds—\$30.4 million—a year from the network—slightly more than double the present take.

He will get it by raising the rent which British television companies pay for using government transmitters. The hike starts in 1964. Britain has only two television networks—the British Broadcasting Corporation financed by annual license fees paid by set owners and the commercial system run by different companies in different areas.

NEA Issues Annual Report On Education

WASHINGTON (AP)—There are 46 million school-age children in the United States, nearly 10 per cent of them in California. Thirty-six per cent of the total U. S. population is age 17 or under, 25 per cent in the 5-17 age bracket.

The average American aged 25 or older has completed 10.6 years of school, ranging from 12.2 years in Utah to 8.7 years in Kentucky and South Carolina. These figures, and dozens more, which illustrate the problems and the impact of education in this country were reported today by the National Education Association in its annual "Rankings of the States."

For instance, Utah, with the highest average education, tied with Washington the lowest percentage of Selective Service reg-

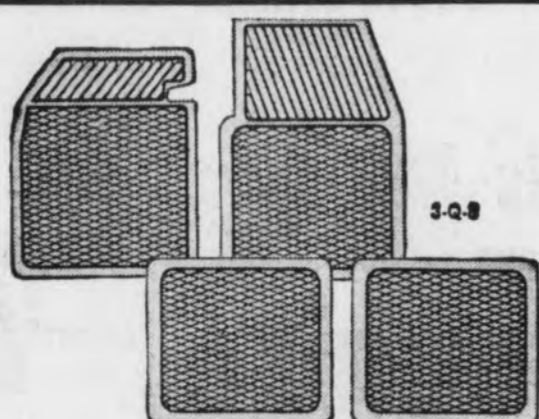

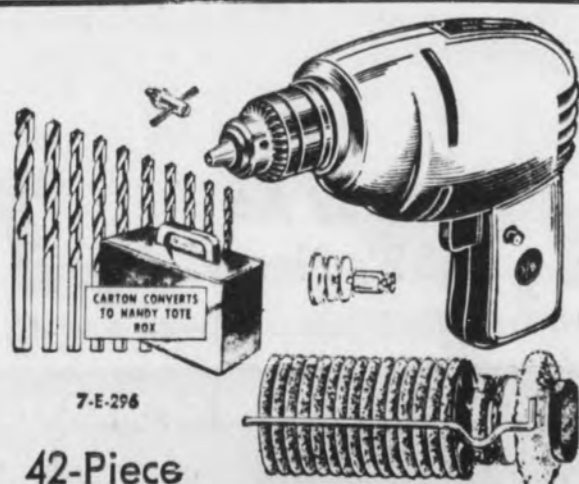

Relief Costs For County Rise 13 Per Cent; Surplus Food Distributed To 5,350 Persons

Relief costs for Marquette County went up again last month. James B. Scanlon, Negaunee, director of the social welfare department, reports.

Relief costs totaled \$71,868.07, a rise of 12.85 per cent, or \$8,183.38, from the January figure of last year.

Direct relief commitments totaled \$19,572.86, or \$3,084.31 more than for December, while social welfare expenses amounted to \$22,295.21, or a boost of \$8,121.27 from the previous month's total.

The last load last month was 342, up 15 from the year ago number. Last year the case load averaged 315. In 1961 it averaged 261.

Direct relief expenses, such as surplus food and clothing, etc., for those under 65 and determined to be in need, are shared with the state.

Hospitalization Big Factor
However, Marquette County has to pay for all the costs of administering the social welfare program, including hospitalization, and for hospitalization and physicians' fees for those on direct relief.

Biggest factor of the relief load in the county is hospitalization, which has been averaging around two-thirds or more than a half of the total in recent years.

Surplus commodities last month were given out to 349 public assistance families and to 1,148 non-relief cases, with the combined 1,497 families representing 5,350 persons.

Commodities given out consisted of beans, butter, peanut butter, white flour, cheese, lard, dried milk, rice, chopped meat, rolled wheat and shortening, totaling 75,177 pounds.

April 18 Set For Selective Service Tests

Applications for the selective service college qualification test to be given on April 18, 1963, are now available to college students at the Marquette County Draft Board office in Marquette.

Col. Arthur A. Holmes, state director of selective service, said the test will be given at 21 colleges and universities in Michigan. College students may obtain full information about the test from any selective service local board.

Applications for the test must be postmarked no later than midnight, Thursday, March 28, 1963. Eligible applicants must be satisfactorily pursuing a full-time college course leading to a degree and be a selective service registrant who intends to seek deferment as a student.

Applicants can take the test only once.

Evidence Of Aptitude
Scores made on the test will provide local boards with evidence of aptitude for continued undergraduate and graduate study and serve as a guide to local boards in the deferment of individual registrants.

Deferments may be granted by local boards for qualified students to enable them to finish both undergraduate and graduate degree programs.

U.S. Facing Grim Choice On Test Ban

GENEVA (AP)—U.S. and British disarmament negotiators seemed to face a grim choice today between unacceptable Soviet terms for a nuclear test ban or failure after four years of negotiations.

Despite the Soviet stand, American and British spokesmen said their governments would persevere with their efforts in the 17-nation disarmament negotiations. They said they thought agreement still was possible.

Job Security Bill Proposed By Jacobetti

State Rep. Dominic J. Jacobetti (D-Negaunee), Marquette County District, announced today he has introduced a master employment security bill in the State Legislature.

Purpose of the unemployment insurance, Jacobetti said, is the provision of benefits for workers who are involuntarily unemployed. Michigan has a series of disqualification provisions which are very harsh. This bill proposes to redress these wrongs and extend benefits to workers unemployed because of circumstances over which they have no control.

In most cases this bill does not really propose new language, he said, but rather the restoration of old provisions which were in the law for many years before the Legislature adopted more and more restrictive amendments to impose new qualifications and more stringent tests of eligibility.

Requirements Lowered
Jacobetti said these provisions can be justified by comparison with laws in a majority of other states as well. This bill would also increase the coverage of unemployment compensation to over 100,000 additional workers by reducing the number of employees in an establishment from four to one in order to receive benefits. Also, it is proposed that the level of benefits be raised so as to provide minimum benefits in order to live.

Michigan began the payment of unemployment benefits in 1938. In that year the average weekly wage in covered employment was \$29.06. The maximum benefit was \$16 a week or 55 per cent of the average wage. The average payment was \$13.49 or 46 per cent of the average wage.

At present the average state-wide wage is above \$110 a week. The basic maximum payable to workers without dependents is \$30, or 27 per cent of the average wage. The maximum payable to a worker with maximum dependents is \$55, which is about 50 per cent of the average wage, and lower than the \$16 maximum in 1938, when expressed in terms of the average wage. Average payment for a week of unemployment is \$36.86, or 33 per cent of the average wage.

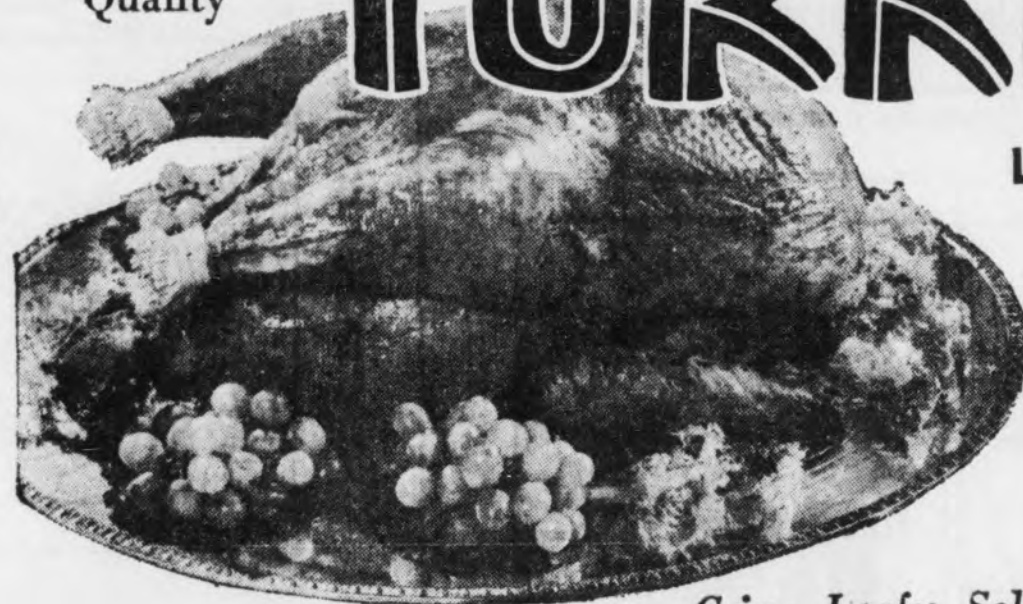

GWINN — Unanimous approval was given by approximately 100 Forsyth Township residents attending a public meeting in the Gwin Clubhouse to a proposal that the township board engage the services of a consulting engineering firm for the purpose of procuring a preliminary report on the cost of a proposed new sewage disposal plant.

Board members held the public session to learn opinions of residents regarding the sewage facility for which the board hopes to obtain a federal grant under the Accelerated Public Works Act that will defray at least 50 per cent of the cost of constructing the plant.

Under Consideration 12 Years

Supervisor Anthony Taccolini, introducing the subject, noted that a sewage disposal plant had been under consideration for 12 years with the first study regarding such a facility being made in 1950.

Russell Johnson of Escanaba, Upper Peninsula engineer for the Michigan Department of Health, told residents that complaints regarding sewage being discharged into the Escanaba River had been received from downstream fishermen for several years. A meeting regarding this problem was held in 1950, and a second session was called in 1960 to determine if any progress had been made in solving the question, he disclosed.

"The State Health Department has been encouraging the township board to engage engineers to prepare plans to determine the costs of the sewage disposal plant," Johnson said.

Taccolini reported that a con-

tract had been made with Francis Engineering Co. to determine costs of the project.

Queried regarding the cost, Taccolini replied that one plan suitable for Gwin would cost \$150,000, of which the local share with a federal grant would amount to \$75,000. To retire the indebtedness in 30 years would necessitate a sewage charge equal to the present water rate. Another proposal would require an annual sewage charge of \$25. The supervisor revealed that the plant would be located on land which the township could lease from Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co.

Discussion on the proposal centered around costs of the project, whether or not New Swany and other areas located outside the plat of Gwin would receive service, types of plants that would meet the needs of the area, what amount the school district would pay for providing service to the new high school currently under construction, the danger of too many septic tanks contaminating the present water system, and whether the cost should be defrayed by selling revenue bonds or through a general tax obligation levy.

In approving the proposal to obtain a preliminary report, citizens recommended that inquiries be made of several firms concerning fees for providing engineering services for the program, and that application be made to the federal government for a loan to cover the cost of obtaining plans and specifications.
