by Robert W. Ferguson and Allan H. Stobbe (Hollbrook Press, Inc. Boston) in

under the chapter (6) entitled "Capacity to Commit Crime" the authors have this to say ~~under the~~ about the subject of unconscious as a defense to crime:

"It has ^{been} generally stated that if a person was unconscious and unaware of what he was doing, no degree of criminality can attach thereto. This rule applies only to cases of ~~the~~ persons of sound mind, for example, somnambulists or persons suffering from delirium of fever, epilepsy, a blow on the head or the removal of drugs or intoxic.

liquor, and other cases in which there is no functioning of the conscious mind and the person acts are controlled solely by the subconscious mind. →

→ "An act done in the absence of will is not more the behavior of the actor than is an act done contrary to his will. It, so long as it is not voluntarily induced such as by intoxication is, therefore, a complete defense to a criminal charge."
