#### FRANCE MUST SPEND Enormous sum in U. S.

Paris.—France must agend three billion frances in the United States during the coming year on wheat, cotton, oats, coal and machinery, said Eugenel Schneider, who has just returned from a mission on behalf of the government to the United States.

"The American state and the government," the Journal quoted him assaying, "cannot and will not advance this sum. The day of state loans to a state is over. It is essentially a warmeasure and its loan would paralyze private initiativs.
