FOREST FIRES:

Several fires occurred on our land in cut-over areas along railroads, but they were small and were put out before becoming major fires and doing any damage to standing timber.

LAND LOOKING:

A total of 38 days was spent land looking, covering an area of 6,260 acres. Also 120 days were spent checking land operated by jobbers and 12 days checking trespasses on 1350 acres.

FORESTRY PINE FARM:

No work was done on this project during the year.

LAKE FRONTAGE:


A topographical survey was made of our land in Sections 2 and 3, 47-23, on Lake Superior, and in Section 35-45-26, Little Shag Lake, but no lots were staked. A new law has been passed in the State of Michigan making it necessary to file recorded plats of all lands offered for sale. This will require the setting of all plat corners in concrete and will increase the cost of survey. A road was constructed in the Johnson Lake area, Section 27-45-25, and culverts were put in on the road in the Horseshoe Lake area, Section 27-48-26.


UNITED STATES FOREST EXPERIMENTAL STATION, DUKES, MICHIGAN:




SECTION 7 T. 46N., R. 19 W.




SECTION 18 T. 47 N., R. 22 W. SCALE: 1"-800" RAS.








SECTION 13 T. 45N., R. 23 W. SCALE: 1"-800"






SECTION 15 T. 46N., R. 23 W. SCALE: 1"-800" RA.3.







THE CLEVELAND-CLIFFS IRON COMPANY

TIMBER SALES

The cash sales of timber amounted to \$6,972.50 and embraced 1,695.37

STUMPAGE SALES

The total earnings under various stumpage permits for the year amounted to \$33,220.67 and represents pulpwood, ties, mining timber, and other miscellaneous forest products sold on a stumpage basis and these are shown in detail on the accompanying statement.

PULPWOOD PERMITS

The stumpage earnings from this source included sales of spruce, balsam, and poplar, and amounted to \$4,816.77. This was considerably less than the previous year but was due to the fact that The Munising Paper Company purchased only a very small quantity of pulpwood locally and also there were only limited purchases by the other paper companies. 17 permits were active during the year.

SOFTWOOD TIE PERMITS

10 of these permits were active during the year, and the earnings from this source amounted to \$4,336.72, which was considerably over the previous year, and in addition to this amount we also earned \$795.30 in connection with the handling of the deliveries. The total deliveries of ties were 22,598 pieces.

CHEMICAL WOOD

23 permits were active during the year, and the total deliveries amounted to 21,351.12 cords, and the earnings \$7,714.43, which was considerably under last year.

MISCELLANEOUS PERMITS

23 permits were active during the year, and these covered miscellaneous logs, mining timber, cedar poles, posts, etc., and the total stumpage earnings amounted to \$16,157.56, which was considerably under the figure of last year due to the fact that in 1939 this item included the stumpage on the hardwood logs delivered to the Piqua plants. In addition to this stumpage item, we also show an earning of \$953.61 on deliveries of these products.

MISCELLANEOUS STUMPAGE SALES

\$556.40 was earned from this source, and this represents small miscell-aneous lots of timber for fuel and building purposes.

TRESPASSES

\$380.72 stumpage was recovered during the year.

LAND AND TIMBER NEGOTIATIONS

GROUP 1 LANDS

There were no large inquiries for lands in this group during the year, and the principal quotations were those made to George Hyde covering lands in Sections 9 and 14 and 15, 47-9, covering which sales were made, and also to John F. Wood covering Entire Section 22-47-10, and to George Hyde covering lands in Sections 21 and 28, 47-9.

RANGE 24 LANDS

We made a number of quotations on lands in this group but without success. The Peter and Lawrence Gagner contract was modified to include the lands in Section 8-46-24.

MISCELLANEOUS

We had the usual number of inquiries for lands during the year, largely for timber purposes. The market prices for forest products of all kinds were about the same as the previous year.

LAKE AND RIVER FRONTAGE

A few inquiries for lake frontage lands were received during the year, and the principal sale was to Carl M. Weideman and wife covering Lot 3 and a part of the SW¹/₄ of SE¹/₄, Section 28-47-20, bordering on Lake Superior. The consideration was \$1500.00 and involved 47.18 acres. We also sold Lot 1, Section 28-46-30, containing 26.80 acres, for \$400.00, and in addition thereto, we disposed of 10 parcels on Johnson and Bertrand Lakes near Gwinn.

There is nothing new to report with reference to the so-called Johnson trespass on Gold Lake.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

NATIONAL FORESTS

No new sales were made in the National Forests during the year, but we did dispose of the SW_{4}^{1} of SW_{4}^{1} , Section 15-46-18, to the Federal Forest Service, which it purchased for the benefit of Camp Evelyn, as part of the land was occupied in connection with the camp site. The consideration for this was \$1,653.20.

There was no further progress made during the year in the proposed sale of the roadside timber along the Castle Point Road to the Forest Service. This is the same timber covering which a contract was issued to Alger County, which was later rescinded by the County Board.

SENEY WATER FOWL REFUGE

The deed covering the SW_4^1 of SE_4^1 , Section 34-46-15, was issued in 1939, but we have as yet not been able to make collection of the consideration, but keep continually in touch with the Department, and it is hoped that this will be completed in 1941.

GWINN TOWN SITE

The only transactions in connection with the Gwinn town site were the replacement and modification of the deed which had been issued to the Methodist Church covering Lots 2 and 3, Block 27, and a declaration covering a lost deed on Lot 17, Block 5.

MISCELLANEOUS HOUSE SALES

The Land Department disposed of dwellings 209 and 210 at the Bellevue Farm for a consideration of \$1600.00, and also the large barn for \$200.00. We sold the so-called Peter Adolph property on Lots 37 and 38 of the Cleveland Iron Mining Company's First Addition, Ishpeming, which we had taken over for non-payment of rent and taxes, for \$1600.00, which just about wiped out the rental and taxes due on it. The contract covering Land Department House No. 8 was completed and the bill of sale issued.

MISCELLANEOUS HOUSE SALES (CONTINUED)

The Mining Department sold 17 of its houses at Ishpeming and 97 at North Lake, and the contracts and bills of sale covering these were prepared by the Land Department, and in addition thereto, we prepared seven bills of sale in completion of contracts issued in previous years.

The taxes shown on this statement represent the amount of taxes paid on these parcels by the Company during the previous year. In addition thereto, the lessees of the lots on which the houses were sold by the Mining Department in both Negaunee and Ishpeming will pay the taxes on these properties, and these amounts are not included in the above tax item.

Practically all of our lots suitable for dwelling purposes in both Negaunee and Ishpeming have been leased, but it is possible we may have a few in Negaunee this spring through a re-arrangement of lots along the County Road in the so-called Pendill Location.

MINING DEPARTMENT LANDS

As we have done for a number of years, this Department continued looking after the surface of all lands of the Mining Department.

The Lot and Land Rentals both show a considerable increase. This is due principally to the new leases covering lots in Negaunee and Ishpeming and North Lake.

ROYALTIES

These amounted to \$770.60 for the year and represent the amounts paid by the Advance Industrial Supply Company under its rock license. This was less than the minimum of \$1,000.00 called for by the license, and the Supply Company has been invoiced for the difference of \$229.40.

These people paid the note which became due July 19, 1940, covering a portion of the minimum royalty due for the three previous years.

The total royalties received from this operation to the end of 1940 amount to \$32,073.99, and in addition to this amount the lessee has also paid the taxes.

RENTED BUILDINGS

All of the dwellings of this Department, with the exception of some of those at the Central Location and Forest Lake, were occupied during the entire year. The earnings amounted to \$6,462.23, as compared with \$7,340.77 in 1939, and the decrease is due to the vacancy of the Alger Hotel and also to the sale of the two houses to James Wyse in 1939. The expense amounted to \$1,019.15, as compared with

\$3,418.26 the previous year. There were no extensive repairs made during the year to any of our properties, and the maintenance expense represents necessary repairs to roofs, chimneys, doors, etc., and the usual re-decorating items. The taxes were \$1,413.77, and the insurance \$463.16. There was no depreciation, as these houses are entirely depreciated. The net earnings amounted to \$3,566.15, as compared with \$2,036.73 in 1939.

SALES ACCOUNTS

The usual statements showing a detail of sales accounts accompany this report and contain our comments on each.

RENTAL ACCOUNTS

Accompanying this report are statements showing details of the house rents and Grand Island Rents Receivable, with our comments. There are two or three quite large house rent items which we hope will be materially reduced during 1941.

The balance due on the land rents is approximately the same as the previous year, and roughly represents about a year's rental on the leases. These accounts are being kept after continually, and with good employment conditions continuing for a few years, considerable progress will be made in the reduction of the outstanding accounts.

SURRENDERED AND CANCELLED CONTRACTS

There were no cancellations of land contracts during the year, but we did make a reduction of \$88.00 in the sale price of the contract to Gust Tyynismaa, our Conveyance 4669.

CLIFFLAND FARM

We received \$618.61 in cash, which was applied on the Koskela contract, and this represents deductions by the Northern Dairy Company from deliveries of milk. The crops were about as usual and outside of the dairy operations, the Koskelas do not seem to make any progress. No purchases of crops or dairy products were made by the Company during the year from these people.

BEACH INN

George F. Putvin and wife surrendered their contract covering this property on December 2, 1940, and a new contract was made to Charles R. Everett and wife at a price of \$19,500.00. No payments are to be made by the Everetts and no charges are to be made for interest, taxes, and insurance until May 1, 1941. The contract calls for minimum payments of \$2400.00 per year, in addition to the insurance and taxes.

MANUFACTURERS HOTEL

This place remained closed during the year and was occupied by the Bovans until November as caretakers. On November 12, 1940, the dining room was rented to J. E. Denman for storage of furniture at a rental of \$10.00 per month. The Boy Scouts, under the direction of E. O. Erickson and William C. Duffett, are using the small two-room dwelling in the rear of the hotel.

BELLEVUE AND CLIFFS FARMS

Both of these places remained idle during the year, and the remaining buildings on the Bellevue Farm were sold, as previously mentioned. Portions of the clearings on the farm are being rented to individuals, but the main large clearing at some distance from the dwellings we do not believe will be cultivated for a long time, as the land is run-down and full of quack.

LOCATION IMPROVEMENTS

The only item of this nature was done at the Central Location and amounted to \$22.72, and this is included in the Rented Buildings Maintenance.

ROSENWALD TITLE

There is nothing new to report with reference to this matter, and as stated in last year's report, it will have to be disposed of whenever it comes up in connection with sales of our lands.

MISCELLANEOUS

LAC LA BELLE LANDS

This pertains to the payment of taxes on the 1521.75 acres of timber rights, the softwood rights on which were quitclaimed to us several years ago by The Munising Paper Company. As previously reported, the Newberry Company had paid up the taxes on all of the Lac La Belle lands, as they had included their equities in them in their mortgage to the RFC. We have been waiting to hear from the Newberry Company as to these taxes and finally received an invoice from them in September, 1940, which covered the taxes for the years 1932-39, inclusive, amounting to \$3,961.07, and these were paid in December.

LUNDIN & BJORK GOLD MINING LEASE

The two semi-annual reports received from the Calumet and Hecla Consolidated Copper Company, and Mr. E. L. Derby's comments thereon, accompany this report.

CRAND ISLAND SUMMER RESORT

The usual routine repairs and redecorating were done at the hotel and cottages during the year.

We used the same booklet which had been prepared by Edward Dreier the previous year, and distributed approximately 3600 of them.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION-SECTIONS 27-45-25 AND 27-48-26

The road on Section 27-45-25 is to serve the lots on Johnson and Bertrand Lakes, and it was built at a cost of \$393.20. We also expended \$44.00 for culverts and putting them in, on the road on Section 27-48-26, constructed the previous year. This last mentioned road is to provide access to lots platted in the so-called Horseshoe Lake district.

Both of these roads were instrumental in disposing of a considerable number of lots. They are now County Roads, having been deeded by the Company.

BUNKER HILL MINING COMPANY

LAND RENTALS

The earnings amounted to \$760.33, as compared with \$707.00 the previous year. We also received \$12.00 for rental of the Company barn.

The Consolidated Fuel & Lumber Company surrendered its Lease No. 1215, and in place thereof we granted them a new lease taking in the poultry house and a portion of the Company barn, at an annual rental of \$360.00.

RENTED BUILDINGS

These were occupied continually during 1940, and the earnings amounted to \$628.80, as compared with \$595.80 the previous year. The maintenance expense was \$140.45, and represents merely routine repairs and redecorating, with the exception of a small wood shed for House No. 1, due to the fact that the Company barn was leased

to the Consolidated. In addition to this maintenance expense, \$21.60 was paid for water rates, which is included in the rental paid by the tenants. The insurance paid for the year amounted to \$29.94.

The delinquent house rents will be paid early in 1941, and the land rents item represents principally amounts due from the Consolidated on its various leases, including 1940 taxes.

UNSETTLED MATTERS

This pertains to the Chicago & North Western Railway Company's right of way across a portion of this property, which has been occupied by the Negaunee Oil Company under a lease from the Railway.

On June 20, 1940, we reported to Cleveland an additional gas station site leased by the Railway Company to the North Star Oil Company, Incorporated, and we have as yet not heard from the Cleveland office as to just what disposition will be made of this matter.

THE CLIFFS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

REAL ESTATE SALES

The only item under this heading is the \$1.00 consideration for the easement granted to the Forest Service of the Federal Government for a telephone line crossing the right of way of the Power Company in the NW_4^1 of NW_4^1 , Section 2-45-20.

NEW LEASES

A lease was granted to Godfrey Silas covering a well site in Section 34, 48-27, for a consideration of \$1.00; a lease was granted to the Forsyth Township School District for a school forest at a rental of \$5.00 per year and taxes, which in 1939 amounted to \$1.91; also leases to Arne Greyus and Sam Nurmi for pasture and agricultural purposes, at a rental of \$5.00 and \$1.00 per year respectively, half of which, however, will go to the Arctic Iron Company, as the land is owned jointly with it. We also granted a lease to Leonard C. Clapp covering a boat house site and landing, for a rental of \$6.00 per year, on the AuTrain Basin; and a lease to Samuel Richards on Lot 23, Deer Lake Location, for dwelling purposes, for \$6.00 per year.

This will acknowledge your letter of July 3rd enclosing a copy of a report by Mr. T. M. Broderick, Geologist for Calumet & Hecla Consolidated Copper Company, dated July 1st, together with whiteprint map covering the exploration work done from January 1st, 1940 to June 30th, 1940, both inclusive, in the Western part of Section 30, T. 48 N., R. 27 W.

I went out to the Ropes Mine office this morning and went over all this work in detail with Mr. Frank Lundin, the foreman in charge. I also talked to Walter Lundin, his nephew, who is one of the two men employed in test-pitting and trenching mentioned in Mr. Broderick's report. I continue to be convinced that the terms of the option are being lived up to and that the activities, while going forward on a minimum basis, are being conducted in a workmanlike and intelligent manner.

No quartz stringers of mineable width and carrying gold, silver or other minerals in paying quantities, have been encountered in the work done during the first six months of the current year. At present, trenching is being continued in the vicinity of the West quarter corner of Section 30. The trenches shown on the whiteprint map, referred to above, are being connected and additional trenching carried toward the North to approach and eventually reach the ledge out-crops in that direction. As soon as this work is completed, the test-pitting will be continued in the North part of the NW1 of SW1 of Section 30 between the trenches just referred to and other trenches toward the Northeasterly part of this forty. A rather deep ravine of surface material exists here, making it rather difficult to reach ledge.

The trenches near the West quarter corner of the section, now being worked, have encountered some slight sulphide mineralization in the green schist making up the country rock in this locality but no commercial values have been encountered in any of the work during the past six months.

It is understood between Mr. Lundin and me that he will advise me whenever anything of interest is encountered in this work so that I may visit it at once while the exposures are fresh. After these pits have been open for some time following the taking of samples, the dirt walls frequently cave in and cover the exposures.



Herewith is report of work done during the period from July 1, 1940, to December 31, 1940 (both dates inclusive), by Calumet and Hecla on Cleveland-Cliffs lands in Sections 29 and 30, T. 48 N. R. 27 W., Marquette County, Michigan, under option to Lundin and Bjork and Calumet and Hecla.

Surface trenching and pitting continued throughout the period. Two men, under the direct supervision of Frank Lundin, have been continuously engaged in the work.

Efforts to trace the mineralization in the western part of the area southeastward toward the peridotite have not been successful, the overburden being too deep for trenching.

Some work was done in the NE1 of the NW1 of Section 29, north of the Ropes mine. An attempt was made to expose a peridotite contact which crosses this forty, but the rock surface falls off steeply and the overburden becomes too deep to follow the rock without deepening the pits to the extent that timbering would be required. Work in this area was therefore abandoned.

Three maps accompany this report. There is a general map showing trenching on the western forties by years, but because of the congestion on this map, the eperations for 1940 only are shown on a separate print. There is also a map showing the explorations on the $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of the $NW_{\frac{1}{4}}$ of Section 29, north of the Ropes.

Your letter of January 6th to Mr. Elliott and directed to my attention, covering the Lundin-Bjork lease, is at hand. I have read over the report and examined the three whiteprint maps attached to your letter and dated January 2nd, 1941, from Mr. T. M. Broderick, Chief Geologist of the Calumet & Hecla Consolidated Copper Company. This report covers the work done by the latter company on its sub-lease from Lundin & Bjork during the last half of 1940.

I have not had an opportunity to make a field examination of the work done on this property during the last half of 1940. From past experience, however, and from my intimate knowledge of the quality of work done by Mr. Broderick, and under his supervision, I accept this report unhesitatingly. I shall visit this exploration, however, at my first opportunity but that will not be for several weeks.

Mr. Broderick's report for the work done during the last half of 1940 is rather discouraging for two reasons: In the first place, the surface was found to be too deep to expose and sample the ledge in most of the pits and trenches that were dug, both in the West part of Section 30, 48-27 and in the NE_{4}^{1} of the NW_{4}^{1} of Section 29, 48-27, North of the Ropes Mine. In the second place, the mineralization was found to be very poor and non-commercial in value at points where pits and trenches were ledged.

In my report to you, dated January 23rd, 1940, covering the work done in the Western part of Section 30 during the last half of 1939, I called attention to one pit from which a sample was obtained, assaying \$6.83 in gold per ton. All subsequent attempts to follow this ore have failed.

There is no indication in Mr. Broderick's report that the exploration work will be discontinued. I have not talked to him but presume there remain additional areas on this lease where test-pitting and trenching will be warranted and will be carried on during the coming year. It is understood between Mr. Lundin and me that he will advise me whenever anything of interest is encountered in this work in order that I may visit it at once while the exposures are fresh. After these pits have been open for some time following the sampling, the dirt walls frequently cave in and cover the exposures.






