Dear Sir: This will acknowledge your letter of July 10th, enclosing a copy of a report by Mr. T. M. Broderick, Chief Geologist for the Calumet and Hecla Consolidated Copper Company, dated July 2nd, together with two whiteprint maps. The report very briefly describes the exploration work done from January 1st, 1941 to June 30th, 1941, both inclusive. One whiteprint map shows all of the trenching done throughout the years this work has been carried on and the other map shows only the operation for 1940 and 1941. I spent yesterday morning at the property with Mr. Frank Lundin. the foreman in charge. We visited much of the trenching done during 1940 and all of that done during the current year, including the work going on at present. I found two men being employed and am convinced that the terms of the option are being lived up to and that the activities, while going forward on a minimum basis, are being conducted in a workmanlike and intelligent manner. As Mr. Broderick stated in his report, efforts to discover additional mineralization in the area being tested were unsuccessful during the first six months of the year. At the trench I visited yesterday in which the men are now working, and located in the general area near the Northwest corner of the SW4 of the SW4 of Section 30, 48-27, and where the work was done during the first half of this year, stringers of mineralized quartz were being uncovered. Not enough work has been done to estimate either the with length of these stringers but their discovery is encouraging at least. No assays have been made as yet. The work of trenching often is met with discouragement because the ledge surface at many points drops away very suddenly and is too steep to be reached economically by such methods. If enough encouragement can be exposed, however, undoubtedly diamond drilling will be resumed. Already there are one or two localities on the West side of Section 30 where some diamond drilling has been done and additional drilling should be done. The exploration work during the past year has consisted entirely of trenching to expose the ledge surface in search for gold-bearing quartz veins and to expose any possible zones of shearing favorable for gold-bearing mineralization. We examined most of the trenches dug during the year 1940 and all of those which had been opened during the current year up to that time. I found two men being employed, which meets the requirements of the lease and am convinced that the activities, while going forward on a minimum basis, have been conducted in a workmanlike and intelligent manner and in accordance with the terms of the lease. Mr. Broderick's report stated that this work has been continued during the balance of the year and I have no reason to doubt it. The work, however, has failed to discover any additional mineralization

within the area being explored. So far no workable gold veins have been found on the Company lands covered by this lease but there is still considerable acreage to be tested.

FOURTLEATH ADMITAL REPORT

The Association submits here ith its fourteenth annual report covering its activities and also statistical information of the political units of Al or County.

The Association receipts for the year 1940-41 amounted to \$3,935.02 of which \$3,723.97 was membership dues, \$200.00 contribution by the Ford 1 stor Conveny and a refune of \$12.05. Expeditures for the year amounted to \$3,852.09. Receipts in detail and charsification of expeditures are shown in the statement accompanying this report.

The assessed valuation of Association members on returns of valuation for 1940 amounted to \$3,005,147.00 compared with the prior year, this is a decrease of \$249,463.00. The Association represents 50.35% of all the property in Alger County. The assessed valuation of Alger County for the year 1941 is \$6,539,818.00, a decrease of \$159,074.00 as compared to the proceeding year. Rock River Township and the City of lunising showed a total increase of \$47,715.00. Grand Island Township had no change and in the other six townships there was a decrease. The largest decrease was \$76,720.00 in Omota Township. The reason for this decrease is that forest products are being removed quite rapidly and the same is true to a lesser extent in the other township units.

The State Tax Commissioners, in getting up the tentative equalized valuation for this county, gave us an increase of \$300,000.00 over the equalized valuation for the prior year. This office filed a protest with the State Board of Equalization and the \$300,000.00 increase was reduced by \$200,000.00. In fixing the tentative valuation it appears that the State Tax Commission paid little attention to changes in local valuation, as all counties except four were given increases. The Equalization Board reduced hayne County more than \$15,000,000.00.

During the year three elections were held to vote taxes in excess of the 15-mill limitation. Two of these were successful. Munising Township voted two mills for lighting purposes but the officers levied only one mill as two mills would have given them nearly double the amount that they are allowed to spend for that purpose. Burt Township voted one mill for the same purpose. These two levies amounted to a total of \$1.785.39. Mathias Township School District held an election to vote one extra mill for school purposes and this was defeated.

Taxes levied for all purposes in the year 1941 amounted to \$157,422.37. This is an increase of \$1,883.42 over the prior year. Taxes levied in detail for each unit are set up in the statements included with this report. The average tax rate for the year 1941 is 34.31 compared with 32.55 for the prior year.

Alger County General Fund income showed an increase of \$4,564.33 covering 12 months ending July 31, 1,41. This is largely accounted for by increase in current and delinquent tax collections. Account expenditures covering county operations paid through the General Fund decreased \$762.51.

State Institutional Charges covering the care of Alger County Patients in state hospitals and sanatoriums showed an increase of \$2.169.55 covering the 12 no. th period ending September 30, 1941. No payments were nade to the State and the amount unpaid at the above date amounts to \$46.286.56. This is nearly equivalent to one year's tax levy.

The Relief load, covering the celender year 1941, showed a considerable decrease compared with the previous years, the average case load was lower by 31 cases. Funds provided for the year amounted to \$36,208.90 of which \$19,315.65 came from the State Welfare Board. The State funds are used entirely for direct relief. The County must provide for administrative, infirmary and hospitalization expense. County funds and sundry collections amounted to \$16,693.25.

The Alger County Road Commission, for 12 months ending September 30, 1941, had a total income of \$191,667.19. The principal sources of income for the Road Commission are from the Neight and Gas tag and the State Maintenance contract. During the year in review state maintenance income amounted to \$96,154.17. Expenditures for the period amounted to \$190.066.05. This is an increase of \$11,503.91 compared with the prior year and is accounted for largely in the following classification: State trunk line maintenance, equipment repairs, new equipment and county road meintenance. Hew equipment amounted to \$15,099.06 of which a large portion was contracted during the years 1938.39. At December 31, 1941 the Road Commission had outstanding only two equipment notes amounting to \$7,000.00. In view of the fact that 6% interest on these contracts is included in the cost of the equipment it follows that purchases made on the deferred payment plan are very expensive.

During the year county road construction was carried on in cooperation with the W. P. A. A surmary of these expenditures is as follows:

There is no financial distress in any of our townships. Total township centingent expenditures for 12 months ending thereh 31, 1941 amounted to \$17,251.25. A decrease of \$369.07 as compared with the prior year. There is a wide variation in the total compensation of township officers. In the past year this varied from \$1,957.35 in Punished Township down to \$274.00 in Grand Island. This office encenvors to seep these does as low as possible, but what is really needed is better control through new legislation and some constitutional amendments. All the collections should be made by the County Treasurer. Without Consissioners should be entirely done away with and the other township officers either entirely done away with or their duties reduced.

In the City of Lamising the Commissioners' tentative budget for 1941 was naterially increased over the previous year. At the budget hearing this Association protected this increase and the City Commissioner made a reduction of \$2,000.00. In recent years too many of our local Governmental units have followed the spending example set in Washington. The sponsoring of W. P. A. projects is a heavy burden on local units. In Alacr County during the past year, the major projects were sponsored by the City of Munising and the Alacr County Road Commission.

The Purping Plant was operated more economically during the current year. Operating costs showed a decrease of \$1,324.51 and not profit and increase of \$556.18. The callons pumped was approximately the same at the prior year but there was a small decrease in account revenue.

The stool districts in general are in about the same condition and the beginning of their school year. Both income and expenditures increased leaving a balance on hand in all school districts at July 1, 1941 of \$27,786.19. The prior year balance was \$25,246.36. Two districts had a deficit at the end of both years, namely Au Train and Onota. Due to increased legislative appropriations it is indicated

that school income will show increase during the 1941-42 year. There have been some salary increases and whether or not this will off-set the increased income cannot be definately stated at this time. Average membership showed a decrease of 162 pupils, spread quite uniformly throughout the eight districts. Your Association is keeping careful cheek on all tax levies and expenditures of public funds and promoting economy and efficiency at all times. We keep the local units informed as to their financial status and can thus, in many cases, prevent extravagant expenditures in pointing out that the finances are not sufficient. We wish to repeat that we are glad at all times to furnish any special reports or information on request of our members. We thank you for your cooperation. Respectfully submitted. J. I.
