

The ore on north side of shaft, or deposit proper, is higher in phosphorus than on upper levels.

On 13th, or 726 foot level, the ground has been fairly well explored, and shows a smaller amount of ore than on upper levels.

The ore body south of shaft which started in at floor of 11th level made fair size at 12th, and we hoped would at least hold as big down to this level.

On 14th, or 791 foot level, we have but just started to open out for plat.

One diamond drill hole was bored from 12th level, one from 13th, and one from present bottom of shaft during the last year, and no additional ore shown up.

It is apparent that we are about to the bottom of this ore basin, and although we expect a small amount of ore on the 14th level, it is quite doubtful if shaft will ever be required to go deeper.

You may expect a smaller proportion of Bessemer Ore and a lessening of the output from this time on.

The amount of ore now in sight we estimate at 300,000 tons.

The ore in this mine is roomed out with square sets; pillars are taken out by square sets, by drift sets and are sometimes pulled. Occasionally a pocket or bunch of ore is mined out without timber.

Rock is left when practicable, and that which has to be mined is wasted in the rooms, which by this means are partially and sometimes wholly filled.

Contracts in this mine are let at so much a car for ore delivered at the shaft; the miners doing their own tramping and timbering. In places where this is not expedient, the miners break the ore and run it into a chute from which the trammers, on contract at so much a car, deliver the ore to the skip.

Rock drifting and the sinking of main shaft is by the foot. Very little work is done except by contract.

In the swamp south of the diorite bluffs, south of the mine, there was put down during the year five diamond drill holes. The surface of muck and sand varied from 23 to 112 feet in thickness, and drill showed up a shallow lean ore basin lying on the diorite. The deepest hole going down 490 feet in the ledge.

We expect during the coming winter to put down some drill holes in the mud pond south-west of Lake Sally.

During year have taken down and repaired two of the old horizontal tubular boilers, and rebricked them. The third old boiler has been taken out and converted into an air receiver, not considering it safe for steam any longer. Have also put in a small engine, car and incline road to bring coal from pile into boiler room.

Mr. Thomas Buzzo is the Mining Captain, and the cost statement is all sufficient to speak for him.

FITCH MINE.

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This mine was 150 feet deep when we took hold of it a year ago.

It consists of two small ore bodies, termed the north and south deposits.

The south deposit is now 231 feet deep, and has not averaged over fifteen feet square. Of late this deposit has been going so flat that it is impracticable to follow it further with skids and bucket. This deposit has shown soap rock and jasper walls until near the bottom, where a regular conglomerate hanging comes in. Enough water makes to require a small pump.

The north deposit is now 199 feet deep, and shows a regular conglomerate hanging. The ore body has fallen back in the foot some and crowded towards the shaft. It is about twice the size of the other deposit.

From this deposit a raise holed up into the shaft which has since been dropped to this bottom. The new direction taken by this ore body and its increasing size gives promise of enabling us to continue the main shaft in the deposit, thereby decreasing the cost.

If work is continued we will stop the mining in south deposit and sink in north deposit with the main skip.

Amount of ore in sight is not over 15,000 tons.

The ore in both deposits has been mined by sinking stopes.

During last year a contract was given to Messrs. Curnow & McDowell to deliver this ore on railroad cars at mine.

If arrangement is made to work the mine during coming year, we will let contract to Captain John Curnow, who has great hopes of the ore deposits getting larger.

OPTIONS.

Option No.1 of land in Section 8 west of the Barnum Mine was abandoned shortly after being taken out. The parties found that it was a large boulder of iron ore that they had found instead of the ledge.

Option No.2 of land in Section 26 south-east of the Foster Mine has been working more or less since it was taken out a year ago. The parties have put on a boiler and pump, and apparently mean business, but have not as yet found any merchantable ore.

Option No.3 of land in Section 12 south of Negaunee was abandoned after a small amount of work was done.

Option No.4 of land in Section 3 a few miles east of Negaunee and east of the Buffalo Group of mines did not find anything, though considerable work was done, and some diamond drill holes put down. The country seems to be quite lean.

Option No.5 of land in Section 21 east of the Winthrop and Mitchell has been working more or less all summer. Considerable work has been done in all, and the ore formation of the Mitchell has been found, but apparently at point tested shows no merchantable ore. From the fact that they did not find any water, we think there is no doubt but that they have struck in the Mitchell formation. They expect to keep on here, and although idle just at present, as soon as they raise a little money will go ahead again.

Option 6 of land in Section 20 west of the Winthrop was abandoned after a few pits were put down that did not show anything of value.

Option No.7 of land in Section 2 west of the Barnum Mine has been working for over a year. The men have not accomplished a great deal, and it is doubtful in our minds whether they ever will find anything. Have examined their work a number of times. They show a lean hematite ore, which is an extension west of the Teal Lake Range.

Option No.8 of land in Section 15 west of Goose Lake was taken out by parties who were working on land adjoining this to the west, and expected to drive across the line from the bottom of a shaft they had there. They became discouraged and gave it up.

Option No.9 of land in Sections 33 & 34 east of the Volunteer Mine was taken out by party who thought there was a good showing for ore, basing his conclusions on some work done on land adjoining east, and when he took option out supposed they would have no difficulty in finding ore, but a closer examination of the work on the land east, and the cleaning out of one or two of their pits, convinced them that there was little prospect of their finding anything of value, and they gave it up.

Option No.10 of land in Section 29 south-west of the Winthrop considerable work was done on. They did not find anything but diorite and gave up the option.

Option No.11 is one of the Cleveland Iron Mining Co's options.

Option No.12 of land in Section 4 east of the Buffalo Group of mines, and of land on which the old Pioneer Mine is located, has been working for about a year. The man who has the option has spent most of his time on it and employed others when he could get them. As he is poor pay, he has not had much help. He feels confident of being able to find a workable body of ore. He has shown up some small streaks of good ore and considerable lean ore.

Option No.14 of land in Section 12 south of Negaunee was abandoned after six months unsatisfactory work. The parties did not find anything but lean ore.

Option No.14 of land in Section 5 west of the Barnum Mine has not as yet shown anything of value, and parties desire to lay off until Spring. As they worked faithfully have given them this privilege, conditional on no one else wanting the land or land in the vicinity that this option ties up. In case that any one does, they are to resume work at once. They have found a hard ore formation, but the ore is quite poor and a great deal of chlorite makes in it.

Option No.15 is of Cleveland Iron Mining Co's land.

Option No.16 of land in Section 19 south of Negaunee and north of the Volunteer is still in force, and have as yet found no good ore occurring in any quantity.

Option No.17 of land in Section 21 south-west of Goose Lake was abandoned after a few months work.

Option No.18 of land in Sections 21 & 22 south-west of Goose Lake showed up some lean hard ore. Not finding enough to warrant them in keeping on they abandoned the property.

Option No.19 of land in Section 12 south of Negaunee has found what is probably the best showing of any of the options. They have a pit down about 25 feet, and the ore shows about ten feet wide. The ore is not clean, but will average over 50%, and they are in hopes of finding it better as they go deeper.

By another year we hope to have a map showing graphically the work done on all of the options. Fifty dollars was charged for each option.

LEASES.

During the year two leases were granted, for each of which \$50.00 was obtained.

The 1st or lease No.3 of land in Section 25 north-west of Ishpeming was leased as a serpentine quarry. The parties taking out the lease did some exploration work, and at first thought they had a good thing, but the rock proved to be too full of seams to make a workable quarry, and we think it is their intention to permanently abandon it.

The 2nd lease, or No.4 is one to the Adamant Paint & Color Co. of land in Sections 17 & 18 south of Negaunee, and provides for the payment of a small royalty on lean ore suitable for paint. Also providing that in case merchantable ore is found that the regular rate of royalty is to be exacted. These parties we think mean business, and we trust that next year they will ship considerable material.

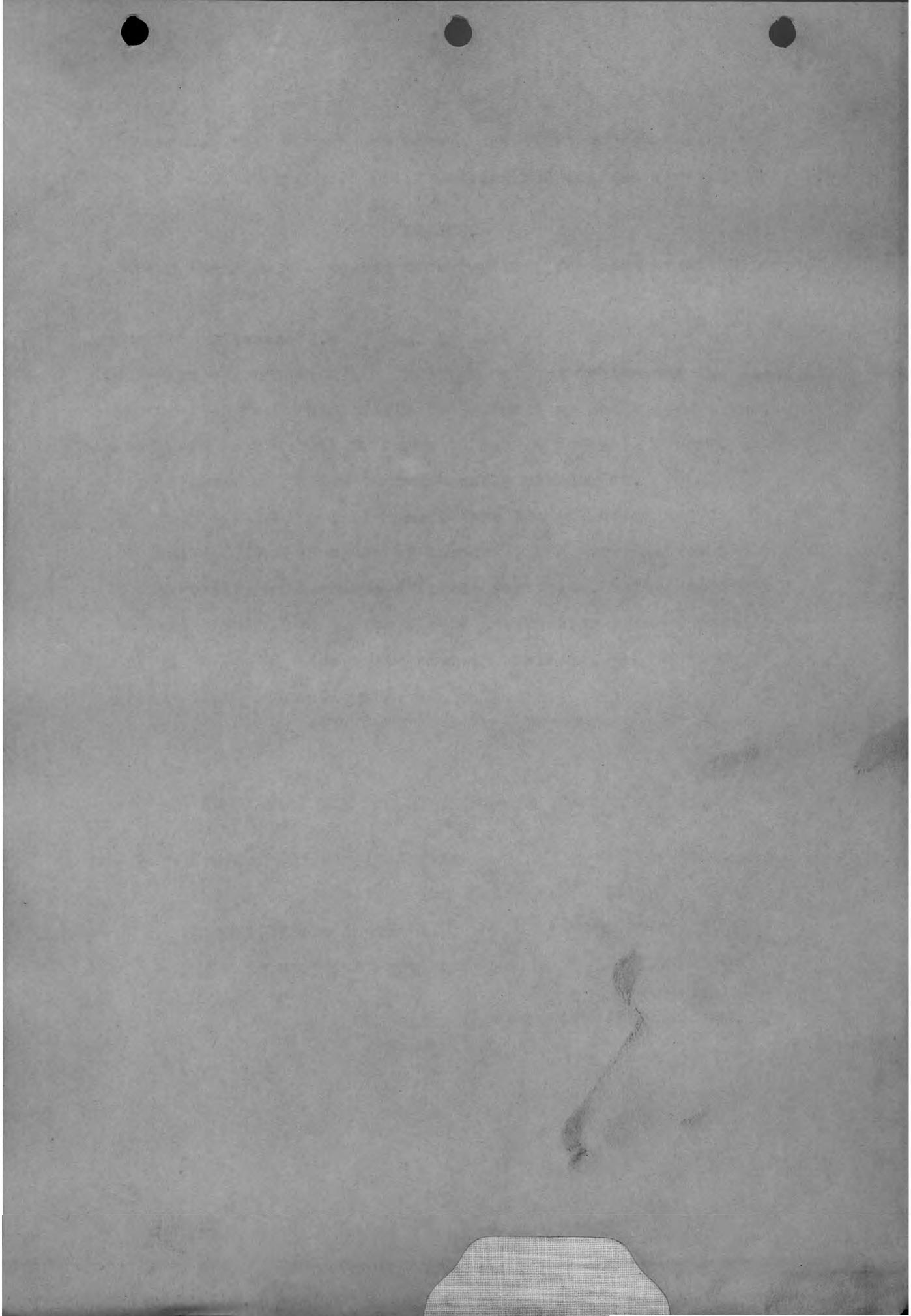

The decrease in profits in 1892 was the result of lower prices and inability to sell all of the ore. The greater part of our unsold ore is of the hard, non-bessemer grade from the "Cliffs Shaft" mine, which the consumers have used very sparingly of late years, the soft ores both bessemer and non-bessemer having increased in favor and in supply, greatly to the disadvantage of those mines producing the hard varieties, especially when they are non-bessemers. The Lake Superior region produced much more ore last year than the market needed, hence very low prices and largely increased unsold stocks.

Real estate has been decreased \$15,950.70 by the sale of town lots, farm lands, standing timber, and stumpage of one-half cent a bushel on charcoal used in Pioneer Furnace and made from wood cut from our lands.

Owing to the depression in pig iron prices, the Pioneer Furnace blew out in July and remained idle the rest of the year.

The mines are in good condition except the "Salisbury," which shows signs of short life at the present large rate of production. Explorations are in progress, but so far without a favorable result. The annexed reports give you a summary of the net profits, amounting to \$172,944.88, a general balance sheet for November 30th, 1892, as compared with November 30th, 1891, also statements comparing the production and profits of the last three years, with the three years previous to the time when the present management took hold, viz : 1890-1892 compared with 1887-1889.

Report of Superintendent of Lands and Fuel.

To Wm. G. Mather Esq, President

I hereby report on matters relating to this department, the annexed description, and estimates of timber of our lands; and memorandum of work to be done forming a part of report.

Fuel.

Charcoal was provided for the furnace until it quit operations in July.

Total number of bushels provided 1,133, 861

Bushels bought outside 762.869

Bushels made at Company Kilns 371,762

Acre of Company lands cut over 253

Sales of Timber.

The timber sold amounts to £2079.83. This timber was all scattered timber, or left after the hardwood had been cut, following our general policy of not selling timber until all we require has first been cut, then selling what is left and is not wanted for our own use.

Farm Lands Leased.

Farm lands comprising 680 acres are under lease to eleven tenants, for a rental of \$96⁰⁰, tenants pay in taxes \$121²⁸, which is a further saving to the Company. These are what I may call in good standing, and are likely to be good permanent tenants during term of leases.

There are others who have failed to pay up and will forfeit their leases, and are not counted in above.

I think the number of tenants will increase only slowly, perhaps about the same as last year, the objection always being that the term of lease is too short. It is no criterion that our lands are not suitable for farming, or are not wanted, because we are getting so few tenants; we have a good deal of land suitable for farming.

Sale of Farm Lands.

There were 200 acres sold for \$1260⁰⁰. Sales of farm lands would be greatly increased, as soon as it is decided which lands are for sale, and then place a low price on them. I do not find that the reservations in farm land deeds are any particular objection to the sale of land.

Right of Way of Railroads.

This has been an extensive piece of work to place in the way required. It is now finished except the remarks our attorney may desire to make, and is a complete record of these matters as shewn in "book of railroads crossing our lands".

Examination of Lands.

This is being attended to and all information, regarding purchase, sale, lease &c., topography, buildings, mines, quality of soil, and estimates of timber are now being prepared for entry in plat book. The annexed description and estimates show pretty fairly the condition of lands, and is of some value until new examination is made.

Work in relation to new furnace.

Considerable work has been done looking over timber lands, location for furnace, making drawings and estimates of various kinds.

Farms.

An income was derived from farms as follows:

Farm at Maple Ridge, Rent 60⁰⁰ Taxes 2 1/4²

Cliff Farm, Rent 450⁰⁰

Houston farm was run company account at a profit, if it is rented this present year we would get about 300⁰⁰ for it. The Maple Ridge and Cliff farms can be rented this year about the same as last year.

Report on work required to be done in
looking after lands.

We should spend two days each month at
each of the following places, to prevent
trespass and blaze lines: Felch lands,
Perkins, Ford River, 22 mile Post, Maple Ridge,
Restoria and Goose Lake; four days near
Marquette and four days south of Cliffs
location and Winthrop Mine; it is not
likely the work can be done with regularity
as above on account of other work, sometimes
it is impossible to get around for a month or
so, at other times we can spend more time
at those places: the lands want looking after
particularly in winter time to prevent trespass;
the small jotters in cedar and other timber are
numerous and this is the season of busiest
operations, it is necessary to look over lands
frequently as the trespasser claims ignorance
of lines and escapes any penalty if he is poor:
when these men know our lands are closely
looked after they keep away from them. In
addition to above we have some lands in S. 44 & 45
R. 26 which require special attention this winter.

Other work necessary to be done is surveying
and running lines for such timber or land as
may be sold or farms rented, looking for
corners and replacing them with permanent
monuments as we have time examining

lands and timber applied for by intending purchasers, and drumming up delinquent tenants for ground rents.

As to office work there is generally some map work required to be done, writing applications, contracts and deeds, seeing people about lands and timber and correspondence about same: at certain times special matters have to be attended to, such as taking inventories, checking tax receipts, and a variety of other things, such as making out occasional reports and statements. For ordinary office work outside of drawing about two days a week is necessary.

Special work called for by Mr. Farrell and by Mr. Mather cannot well be estimated, but it is sure to be considerable: when work is pressing it is always the land looking which has to give place to other work.

If flat book of lands is made as has been spoken of it will be quite an undertaking, and all our ordinary work of looking after lands should be carried on with that object in view; that is, every trip made over any part of our lands should be made systematically and the results of each day's work be recorded for use in flat book.
