

If any corporation neglect or refuse to make and file the reports required, within the time specified, and shall continue in default for ten days after the first day of February, its corporate powers shall be suspended thereafter until it shall file such report, and it shall not maintain an action in any court of this State upon any contract entered into during the time of such default; and any director of such corporation so in default, who has neglected or refused to join in the making of such report, shall be liable for all the debts of such corporation contracted since the filing of the last report of such corporation, and shall also be liable to such corporation for any damages sustained by it by reason of such refusal or neglect.

The statute gives the Secretary of State no discretion in the matter. He cannot grant extension of time, nor excuse failure to file

the report.

Please note the following suggestions:

1. The report will not be filed unless all statements required by the report are made. A blank or line drawn in the place of an answer will not be accepted.

2. The report must be signed by a majority of the directors and

sworn to by the Secretary.

3. The fact that a company has not been organized for a full year, or that it has not been engaged in business during the past year, does not excuse it from filing a report. There is nothing called for in the report depending on the length of time the company has been incorporated, nor the amount of business it has transacted.

By observance of the plain statutory requirements you will avoid a good deal of delay and annoyance both to yourself and to this office.

Section 12. Every corporation subject to this act, including every foreign corporation admitted to carry on business in this State under the provisions of this act, shall annually, in the month of January, make duplicate reports showing the condition of such corporation on the thirty-first day of December next preceding. or if the fiscal year of any corporation shall close within ninety days next preceding said thirty-first day of December the report may be of the condition at the close of said fiscal year, on suitable blanks to be furnished by the Secretary of State, as hereinafter provided: Provided, Flour milling corporations shall make and deposit annual reports in the month of July for the year ending June thirty, preceding. Such reports shall state the amount each of common and preferred capital stock authorized, and the amount thereof subscribed for, and the amount thereof actually paid in, in cash, and the amount thereof paid in property; the total value as near as may be estimated, of all property owned by the corporation; the value of different items or classes of property as follows: Real estate used in its business; real estate not used in its business; goods, chattels, merchandise, material and other tangible property; patent-rights, copy-rights, trademarks and formulas; good will; and all other property, specifying the kind; value of all credits owing to the corporation: the amount of debts of the corporation; the name and postoffice address of each stockholder and the number of shares of preferred and common stock held by him at the date of such report; the name and postoffice address of each officer and director of the corporation, and such other information as the Secretary of State may require. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of State in the month of December in each year, to mail to each corporation which is subject to the provisions of this act, suitable blanks on which shall be printed a copy of this section. Such reports shall be signed by a majority of the board of directors and verified by the oath of the secretary of the corporation, and deposited in the office of the Secretary of State within the said month of January, accompanied by a filing fee of fifty cents. The Secretary of State shall carefully examine such reports, and if upon such examination they shall be found to comply with all the requirements of this section, he shall then file one of them in his office, and shall forward the other by mail or express to the county clerk of the county in which the office in this State, for the transaction of the business of said corporation, is situated. And it shall be the duty of such county clerk, upon receipt of such report, to immediately cause the same to be filed in his office. If any corporation neglect or refuse to make and file the reports

required by this section within the time herein specified, and shall continue in default for ten days after the first day of February, its corporate powers shall be suspended thereafter until it shall file such report, and it shall not maintain an action in any court of this State upon any contract entered into during the time of such default: and any director of such corporation so in default, who has neglected or refused to join in the making of such report, shall be liable for all the debts of such corporation contracted since the filing of the last report of such corporation, and shall also be liable to such corporation for any damages sustained by it by reason of such refusal or neglect. And in case a corporation organized or doing business under the provisions of this act shall be dissolved by process of law, or whose term of existence shall terminate by limitation, or whose property and franchises shall be sold at mortgage sale, or at private sale, or if for any reason the attitude of the corporation toward the State shall be changed from that set forth in the articles of association, it shall be the duty of the last board of directors of such corporation within thirty days thereafter to give written notice of such change to the Secretary of State, simed by a majority of such directors, which said notice all be recorded as amendments are required to be recorded. And in case of neglect to give such notice, they shall each be subject to a penalty of five dollars for each and every secular day during the continuance of such neglect or refusal. The neglect or refusal to file the report, or to record the notice required by this section to be filed or recorded, shall be deemed wilful when such report or such notice is not filed or recorded within the time herein limited. Whenever any corporation has neglected or refused to make and file its report within twenty days after the time limited in this section, the Secretary of State shall cause notice of that fact to be given by mail to such corporation, directed to its postoffice address. The certificate of the Secretary of State or his deputy, of the mailing of such notices, shall be prima facie evidence in all courts and places of that fact, and that such notices were duly received by said corporation. In case any corporation, filing the annual report provided for in this act, shall file with the Secretary of State a bond in the penal sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, with goodland sufficient surety for the fulfillment of its contracts for labor and material, said bond to be subject to suit thereon by all resident creditors of said corporation for labor and material, then it shall not be necessary for such corporation, under this or any other act, to file annually a list of the names and addresses of such stockholders, together with the number of shares of stock held by such stockholders in the annual report herein provided. The sufficiency of the surety offered in the bond aforesaid, shall be determined by the Secretary of State.

All actions and suits based on the neglect or refusal of the officers or managers of such associations to make and file the reports required by this section, shall be commenced within two years next after such neglect or refusal has occurred, and not afterwards.

The report, in duplicate, should be sent to this office, accompanied by a filing fee of fifty cents, which fee is not a perquisite of this office, but must be paid into the State Treasury at the time of the filing of the report.

Postage stamps cannot be accepted in payment of fee.

If any corporation neglect or refuse to make and file the reports required, within the time specified, and shall continue in default for ten days after the first day of February, its corporate powers shall be suspended thereafter until it shall file such report, and it shall not maintain an action in any court of this State upon any contract entered into during the time of such default; and any director of such corporation so in default, who has neglected or refused to join in the making of such report, shall be liable for all the debts of such corporation contracted since the filing of the last report of such corporation, and shall also be liable to such corporation for any damages sustained by it by reason of such refusal or neglect.

The statute gives the Secretary of State no discretion in the matter. He cannot grant extension of time, nor excuse failure to file

the report.

Please note the following suggestions:

1. The report will not be filed unless all statements required by the report are made. A blank or line drawn in the place of an answer will not be accepted.

2. The report must be signed by a majority of the directors and

sworn to by the Secretary.

3. The fact that a company has not been organized for a full year, or that it has not been engaged in business during the past year, does not excuse it from filing a report. There is nothing called for in the report depending on the length of time the company has been incorporated, nor the amount of business it has transacted.

By observance of the plain statutory requirements you will avoid a good deal of delay and annoyance both to yourself and to this office.


