The Secretary of State shall carefully examine such reports, and if upon such examination they shall be found to comply with all the requirements of this section, he shall then file one of them in his office, and shall forward the other by mail or express to the county clerk of the county in which the office in this State, for the transaction of the business of said corporation, is situated. And it shall be the duty of such county clerk, upon receipt of such report, to immediately cause the same to be filed in his office. If any corporation neglect or refuse to make and file the reports

required by this section within the time herein specified, and shall continue in default for ten days after the first day of February, its corporate powers shall be suspended thereafter until it shall file such report, and it shall not maintain an action in any court of this State upon any contract entered into during the time of such default; and any director of such corporation so in default, who has neglected or refused to join in the making of such report, shall be liable for all the debts of such corporation contracted since the filing of the last report of such corporation, and shall also be liable to such corporation for any damages sustained by it by reason of such refusal or neglect. And in case a corporation organized or doing business under the provisions of this act shall be dissolved by process of law, or whose term of existence shall terminate by limitation, or whose property and franchises shall be sold at mortgage sale, or at private sale, or if for any reason the attitude of the corporation toward the State shall be changed from that set forth in the articles of association, it shall be the duty of the last board of directors of such corporation within thirty days thereafter to give written notice of such change to the Secretary of State, signed by a majority of such directors, which said notice shall be recorded as amendments are required to be recorded. And in case of neglect to give such notice, they shall each be subject to a penalty of five dollars for each and every secular day during the continuance of such neglect or refusal. The neglect or refusal to file the report, or to record the notice required by this section to be filed or recorded, shall be deemed wilful when such report or such notice is not filed or recorded within the time herein limited. Whenever any corporation has neglected or refused to make and file its report within twenty days after the time limited in this section, the Secretary of State shall cause notice of that fact to be given by mail to such corporation, directed to its post-office address. The certificate of the Secretary of State or his deputy, of the mailing of such notices, shall be prima facie evidence in all courts and places of that fact, and that such notices were duly received by said corporation. In case any corporation, filing the annual report provided for in this act, shall file with the Secretary of State a bond in the penal sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, with good and sufficient surety for the fulfillment of its contracts for labor and material, said bond to be subject to suit thereon by all resident creditors of said corporation for labor and material, then it shall not be necessary for such corporation, under this or any other act, to file annually a list of the names and addresses of such stockholders, together with the number of shares of stock held by such stockholders in the annual report herein provided. The sufficiency of the surety offered in the bond aforesaid, shall be determined by the Secretary of State.
