


Telephones received from Menominee and Marguette announce the signing of the armistice with Germany at 9 a. m. today. Fighting on all fronts ceased at once. The German envoys subscribed to all terms laid down by Allies. Unconditional surrender of last foes is now assured. The news was celebrated in the city by bells and whistles, while hundreds of students paraded the streets of the city carrying flags and bunting. The city band was gotten hurriedly together and lent additional enthusiasm to the scene. Business houses and dwellings were instantly decorated in honor of the occasion. Later dispatches quote the State department at Washington to the effect that no official confirmation of the signing of the armistice has been received. Reports from Canada however, substantiates the rumor and advise that celebrations are in progress throughout the Dominion.
